WHEREAS, the amount added to taxes shall include late payment charges accrued through June 30 plus an additional administrative charge equal to \$15 for each delinquent account, and

WHEREAS, late payment charges shall not continue to accrue after June 30 against any assessment, penalty, charge or fee which is added to taxes, and

WHEREAS, the City Treasurer will submit to the City Council all delinquent assessments, penalties, charges or fees and any other amounts to be added to taxes, and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of such delinquent amounts the Council must hold a public hearing, and

WHEREAS, after making any amendments or corrections to the list of delinquent accounts the Common Council will by resolution confirm said amounts, and

WHEREAS, upon confirmation of said amounts the City will insert the delinquent accounts in the annual tax rolls and which shall become a part of the annual tax upon the respective parcels against which such amounts are charged and shall be subject to all the provisions of the City Charter. NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Corporation Counsel is hereby authorized and directed to prepare a resolution listing the re-levies and the dollar amount to be added to the tax rolls, and be it further

By Alderman Wohleben:

WHEREAS, in 2014, the City of Lockport was in danger of running out of funds, nearly missed making payroll, and was listed by the New York State Comptroller's Office as a city in serious_fiscal distress, and

WHEREAS, on October 7, 2014, Mayor Anne E. McCaffrey was forced to lay off 9 employees – an administrative coordinator, a clerk in the police department, a senior account clerk in the treasurer's office, a public works supervisor, a highways and parks employee, a deputy corporation counsel and three laborers, and

WHEREAS, in 2014 the City of Lockport got out of the ambulance business due to a reoccurring annual operating loss from ambulance services of \$1.2 million dollars, and

WHEREAS, the cost for the City of Lockport to get back into the ambulance service is estimated to be \$1.5 million, and

WHEREAS, as a result of getting out of providing ambulance service the City reduced the number of firemen for the 3 shifts from 9 to 6, and

WHEREAS through the employee reductions and the replacement of paid ambulance service with an independent ambulance service, as well as other measures, the City of Lockport was able to avoid insolvency, eliminate the previously accumulated \$4 million deficit and adequately fund operations for fiscal years 2014 through 2019, and

WHEREAS the fiscal restructuring that was accomplished enabled the City of Lockport to significantly upgrade its credit rating with both Moody's and Standard and Poor's, and restore fiscal stability and confidence, and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2019, an arbitrator, appointed by the New York State Public Employees Relations Board, ruled that the City violated the Lockport Professional Firefighter's Association Collective Bargaining Agreement by reducing minimum manning per shift from 9 to 6, and

WHERAS, the arbitrator found that the residents and firefighters would be safer with hiring 12 more firemen, and

WHEREAS, on August 10, 2016, the City of Lockport Fire Department with the assistance of mutual aid from 40 neighboring fire companies and 200 firefighters from three counties successfully battled a massive fire at High Tread International – the largest fire in the City's history --with 6-man minimum manning without any injuries to residents or fireman, and

WHEREAS, mutual aid has provided the necessary back up support to our firefighters for years and there is no need to add 12 additional full-time firefighters to the City budget, and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport averages 4 to 23 structure fires a year, and

WHEREAS, the salary and benefits of just one City fireman is \$78,000 without including overtime and legacy costs and the estimated cost to add 12 more firemen exceeds 1.5 million dollars, and

WHEREAS, the annual reoccurring cost to the taxpayers to add 12 more firemen to the budget will exceed \$850,000 a year, and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport should file a motion to vacate the arbitrators decision on the basis that the decision is outside the scope of his authority and that there was no evidence introduced into the record to support a finding that staffing levels of 6 men per shift is unsafe and 12 more firemen must be hired immediately, and

WHEREAS, if the City fails to challenge the arbitrator's decision it will have no bargaining power to negotiate the implementation of the arbitrator's decision pending the appeal, and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost to challenge the arbitrator's decision is far less compared the millions of dollars the city will pay in salaries, benefits and legacy costs for 12 more firemen,

WHEREAS, to not challenge the decision borders on gross negligence, and

WHEREAS, the deadline to challenge the arbitrator's decision is December 7, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the City of Lockport Common Council is hereby on record opposing the determination of the arbitrator on the basis that the arbitrator acted outside the scope of his authority and that decision is not supported by the evidence in the record, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Common Counsel does hereby request the Mayor and Corporation Counsel to immediately direct outside counsel, Bryan Goldberger, Esq., to move to vacate the determination within 30 days of the adoption of this resolution on the basis that the decision is outside the scope of the arbitrator's powers and not supported by the evidence, and be it further

RESOLVED, that in the event the Mayor and Corporation Counsel refuse to take any action to vacate the arbitrator's decision within 30 days of the adoption of this resolution the sum of \$25,000 shall be transferred from contingency to the Common Council's budget to cover the cost of retaining its own independent legal counsel to move to vacate the decision prior to the December 7, 2019 deadline, and be it further

RESOLVED, that in the event the Mayor and Corporation Counsel fail to take such action to vacate the decision within 30 days of the adoption of this resolution the President of the Common Council be and is hereby authorized to enter into an engagement agreement with independent legal counsel for the sole purpose of moving to vacate the award on behalf of the Common Council and the taxpayers of Lockport.

By Alderman Abbott:

Whereas, the Chief of the Police Department has identified a need for an upgrade to its body camera equipment and has recommended same to the City Council; and

Whereas, the Police Chief has obtained a proposal from Axon Enterprise, Inc. in an amount of \$53,320 for the licensing, equipment, and computer software, hardware and data storage in support of body cameras with a reoccurring cost of \$23,580 per year thereafter; and

Whereas, Axon Enterprise, Inc. has provided a statement of justification for a "sole source" designation due to the integration of its data management systems with the Taser equipment currently used by the City of Lockport Police Department and the ability to integrate its body camera equipment into the existing data management systems in place for the Police Department; and

Whereas, the Police Department has a vehicle seized through drug enforcement action that will be auctioned, the proceeds of which can used to fund a portion of the body camera equipment; and

Whereas, the remainder of the cost for the first year would need to be funded through the use of contingency as this expense was not included in the 2019 police budget; and

Whereas, the 2019 General Fund budget must be amended to accommodate these projects;

Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the purchase of the body camera equipment as proposed by Axon Enterprise, Inc. is hereby approved; and be it further

Resolved, that the Mayor, subject to review and approval by the City Attorney's Office, is hereby authorized to execute any contract that might be required to effectuate the purchase and support as identified in the five-year proposal; and be it further
