By Alderman Wohleben:

WHEREAS, Section 198-8 B of the City of Lockport Code grants the Common Council the power to fix, prescribe and regulate the rates and charges for the use of water in said City, and fix the compensation, prescribe the duties and make rules and regulations for the government, its employees, and from time to time to alter said rates or amend or abolish said rules or any part thereof, and

WHEREAS, Section 150-34 grants the City the power to make and enforce such general rules and regulations as to both public and private water supply for the collection, rebating, refunding or adjustment of such charges for any reason, including diversion of water from the sewer system, as may be reasonably necessary to avoid injustice to the end that all property discharging sewage into the sewer system will bear its equitable proportionate share with other property of the cost of operation, maintenance and repairs of said sewerage system or any extension, enlargement, replacement or additions to such sewer system or any part or parts thereof, and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport ("City") receives claims from customers challenging high water and or sewer bills regarding the consumption billed, and

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to implement a policy and standard for processing, determining and settling such claims, and

WHEREAS, the CITY is authorized to correct legitimate errors in billing and may waive the imposition of penalties and interest arising from the nonpayment of the water and or sewer rents in the context of compromising a claim pursuant to the City's general authority to compromise and settle claims arising from contracts; and

WHEREAS, it is within the sole discretion of the CITY to charge and collect penalties and interest, and

WHEREAS, claims for overcharge that are supported by sufficient facts may warrant consideration by the CITY to consider and agree to a compromise based upon the claimant's good faith opposing contentions and facts; and

WHEREAS, the consideration the parties receive under this policy is the avoidance of protracted and costly litigation; and

WHEREAS, CITY is not prohibited from settling claims if it acts with competent authority, in good faith, and for sufficient consideration.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the following Water and Sewer Adjustment Policy be and is hereby adopted:

APPLICATION OF POLICY

This policy is limited to residential properties (owner occupied one or two family homes) and is implemented to offer assistance to properties that experience an unusually high water and or sewer bill due to a limited unforeseen circumstance or event.

It is the responsibility of all property owners who act as Landlord to monitor their rental property and insure that the tenants of the property are not abusing or neglecting the services provided by the City. The water and sewer services are the responsibility of the property owner/landlord and not the tenant unless a separate meter is installed. Therefore, this policy shall not apply to payment disputes between landlords and tenants regarding water and sewer bills.

This policy also does not apply to any other class of customers/users. However, nothing contained within this Policy shall limit/impair or impede the powers and authority granted to the Common Council in sections 150-34 and 198-8 B of the City Code.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Policy is to afford customers an avenue to have their bill reviewed for a correction of an error, consideration for a payment plan under certain circumstances and or waiver of penalties and or interest.

PROCESS

Claims for adjustment may be submitted for review for:

- 1. A faulty meter (wrong model number register with on the wrong base). Customers may request that their meter be inspected. If the meter is working correctly the customer will be charged an inspection fee established by the Common Council by resolution;
- 2. A broken service line caused or related to a broken water main;
- 3. Frozen water service:
- 4. Sewer charges where there is proof that the discharge went into a storm sewer (not combined with sanitary) or ground and not into the sanitary sewer.

Adjustments may be considered for:

- 1. The interest and or penalty portion of the bill and may be reduced or eliminated depending upon the customer's payment history and surrounding circumstances;
- 2. The sewer portion of the bill may be reduced or eliminated if sufficient proof is submitted that the water that passed through the meter did not enter the sanitary sewer system or combined sanitary and storm sewer system resulting in treatment at the City plant. That the discharge went into the storm sewer or ground;
- 3. It is illegal to forgive water bills. However, the customer may qualify for a repayment plan depending upon the following:
 - a. The circumstances surrounding the bill;
 - b. The amount of water lost due to the break or leak;
 - c. The payment history of the customer/property owner;
 - d. The property owner's average usage;
 - e. The knowledge and intent of the property owner in discovering, reporting and repairing the problem.

PROCEDURE

- 1. All claims must be made within 30 days of the date of the bill.
- 2. All claims shall submitted on a form prescribed by the Water Department.
- All claims must first be reviewed by the Water Department and/or Sewer Department and a recommendation with the advice of the Corporation Council, if necessary, shall be made by the respective department to the Water and Sewer Review Committee.
- 4. The Water and Sewer Review Committee shall meet and make a determination as to what, if any, relief or action should be taken or recommended to the Common Council.
- 5. The adjustment may be based upon an average of the four (4) previous quarters of actual consumption plus at least fifty percent (50%) of the registered sewer consumption and at least fifty percent (50%) of the registered water consumption. One leak adjustment request per property per two year period, measured from the date of application.
- 6. If payments are required to pay off the leak, a payment agreement must be signed which sets forth the terms. Payments and all future bills must remain current or the agreement will be terminated. In the event interest and or penalties are waived in an agreement the default in an agreement shall result in the reinstatement/reestablishment of said interest and penalties.
- 7. Proof of a leak and the repair must be presented with the claim. All leaks must be fixed within 1 2 days of discovery.
- 8. The Water and Sewer Review Committee shall be comprised of the Mayor, City Treasurer, Chairman of Water and Sewer Committee, Corporation Counsel and Common Council President.
- 9. This policy will be reviewed annually. The City of Lockport may discontinue this policy at any time.
