WHEREAS, Section C-62 (45) states that "the Common Council may make and establish ordinances, regulations and bylaws as may be necessary and proper and necessary for the health, safety, advantage and good government of the city, and

WHEREAS, Section C-175 states "The Common Council shall have power to enact ordinances and bylaws pertaining to streets, highways, parks and other public places in the city, and to make or order and direct the making of such general or local improvements in the streets, lanes, alleys, open courts, squares, marketplaces, parks or public grounds of said city as it shall deem for the best interests of the said city. The Common Council may make, regulate, repair, amend, alter, and clean the streets, alleys, highways, bridges, side- and crosswalks, wharves, piers, docks, canals and slips in said city and prevent the encumbering of the same in any manner, and protect the same from encroachments and injury; it may reduce, excavate, fill, level, pitch, plank, pave, repave, macadamize, or cover with stone, gravel or other material, make, curb, gutter or flag any of the streets, alleys, lanes, sidewalks, wharves, docks, roads, open courts, squares or public places in said city, and direct the making and repairing of railings at exposed places in the streets; it may direct and regulate the planting, rearing and preserving of ornamental trees, shrubs and plants in the streets and parks; it may make, regulate and repair wells, pumps, reservoirs of water, ditches, gutters, public sewers, drains and vaults, extend water mains in said city; and generally it may order and direct all public improvements and expenditures in the streets, sidewalks, squares and public places in said city, and appropriate and expend all moneys raised by tax, issue and sale of bonds, or assessment for such purposes in said city. But nothing herein contained shall prevent the improving of highways by local assessment," and

WHEREAS, Section C-178. Sprinkling and cleaning, improved streets, states: "An additional sum in this section authorized to be levied shall include an amount to be used for the sprinkling of such improved street with water to lay the dust therein when necessary. The Common Council may let by contract to the lowest bidder, for any period not, however, in excess of three years, the cleaning of such improved streets as it shall, be resolution, designate, and the expense thereof shall be paid from the Highway Fund. Nothing in this section contained, however, shall be construed to prevent the cleaning of such improved streets or any part thereof by and under the direction of the Mayor and Superintendent of Streets as herein otherwise provided, " and

WHEREAS, the condition of city streets are among the most common complaints heard by Alderman/Alderwomen/Council, and

WHEREAS, the Common Council desires to regulate when city streets are cleaned by Ward location and date for the betterment of the city.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Superintendent of Streets prepare and submit to the Common Council a plan for when Streets can be cleaned/swept by Ward, Street, and date determined by the total number of street and highway miles in each Ward, largest to smallest, for consideration by the Common Council for either adoption of said plan by resolution or amendment of sections C-175 and or 178 by ordinance or local law, and be it further

RESOLVED, that in the interim, the Common Council requests the Mayor having the supervisory authority over the Superintendent of Streets to direct the Superintendent of Streets to begin sweeping said City streets by the plan presented to the Common Council as prepared by the Superintendent of Streets.

WHEREAS, the Office of the New York State Comptroller conducted a "Fiscal Street Audit" of the City of Lockport for the calendar year 2013 as well as a "Cash Flow Audit" for 2013, "Independent Audit Services" for 2014 and "Budget Reviews" for 2015 & 2016, and

WHEREAS, several of Councilwomen Mullane's constituents have questioned Councilwomen Mullane why a forensic audit was never conducted by the New York State Comptroller's Office despite the City's fiscal stress and deficit borrowing, and

WHEREAS, a Forensic audit will determine whether the City was and is in compliance with legal requirements and whether internal controls, and

**WHEREAS**, the Office of the New York State Attorney General is presently auditing municipal assessment departments across the State and the Common Council desires that the Office of the Assessor be included in the statewide audit and, if possible, be granted priority status by the Office of the New York State Attorney General, and

WHEREAS, the Common Council also desires to request the Office of the New York State Comptroller conduct a forensic audit of the assessment department, civil service department, water department and that said forensic audits be granted, if possible, priority status by the Comptroller to allow the Common Council sufficient time to prepare its annual budget in November.
