Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Lockport has duly considered the Short Environmental Assessment Form, the proposed Project in its entirety, and the criteria for determining significance set forth in 6 N.Y.C.R.R. 617.7 (c) of the SEQRA regulations, and such other information deemed appropriate; and

Whereas, the Common Council has identified the relevant areas of environmental concern, has taken a hard look at these areas, and has made a reasoned elaboration of the basis for its determination, now, therefore, be it

Resolved, by the Common Council of the City of Lockport as follows:

- 1. The Common Council declares it will serve as Lead Agency for the Project.
- 2. The Common Council declares that the proposed 13 West Main Street Project at the 13 West Main Street, Lockport, New York 14094 will not result in any large and significant impacts, and therefore, the approval of the Project does not include the potential for any significant adverse environmental impacts. Accordingly, the Common Council issued the attached negative declaration under SEQRA for the Project.
- 3. The reasons for the decision are stated in the attached negative declaration.
- 4. This resolution shall be effective immediately.

Whereas, the City of Lockport sees an advantage to an additional 1% increase of the current Bed Tax to aid and promote tourism in Niagara County and the City of Lockport; and

Whereas, the City of Lockport has an opportunity to assist the Niagara Falls National Heritage Area in its operation of the Discover Niagara Shuttle or other entities for transportation or economic development purposes pursuant to New York State Tax Law Article § 1201-d(a) authority to impose tax; and

Whereas, the Discover Niagara Shuttle service presently serves the City of Niagara Falls, and along the Niagara River corridor to the Village of Youngstown; and

Whereas, the several anticipated benefits of a one (1%) percent Bed Tax increase include:

- 1. Promote Tourism by the ease of transportation to and from all tourists' sites in the City of Niagara Falls, Town of Lewiston, Village of Youngstown and, in the future, the City of Lockport and the City of North Tonawanda;
- 2. Increase Shuttle connections to the City of Lockport and City of North Tonawanda;
- 3. Relieve congestion of tourism traffic on the roads, parking, and provide a scenic commute throughout the existing Niagara County tourist locations;

and

Whereas, there are several attractions in the City of Lockport: The Flight of Five Locks, Lockport Discovery Center, and the Lockport Caves, that the Shuttle will promote; now, therefore be it

Resolved, the City of Lockport Common Council requests the State of New York Legislature to draft companion bills for the purposes of increasing the existing bed tax by one (1%) percent designated specifically to the Discover Niagara Shuttle; and be it further

Resolved, that the drafting of this legislation on the State level would provide the City of Lockport the option of passing a Home Rule Message in support of such legislation; and be it further

Resolved, that subsequent to the State's adoption, the City of Lockport would have an opportunity to present a local law which would call for action to allow Lockport residents, Niagara County residents, and visitors to have convenient comfortable transportation between Niagara County attractions; and be it further

Resolved, that City of Lockport Common Council respectfully requests the New York State Senate and Assembly to submit companion Bills that would pave the way for a local law and public hearing and that copies of this resolution be sent immediately to the City of Lockport's State Representatives.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$276,400 BONDS OF THE CITY OF LOCKPORT, NIAGARA COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF THE RECONSTRUCTION OF A CULVERT ON PLANK ROAD, IN AND FOR SAID CITY.

WHEREAS, the capital project hereinafter described has been determined to be a Type II Action pursuant to the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, the

implementation of which as proposed, such regulations provide, will not result in any significant adverse environmental impact; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize the financing thereof, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the Common Council of the City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The reconstruction of a culvert on Plank Road, in and for the City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, including incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$276,400.

Section 2. It is hereby determined that the plan for the financing of said specific object or purpose is by the issuance of \$276,400 bonds of said City hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. It is hereby further determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is fifteen years, pursuant to subdivision 91 based on subdivision 4 and subdivision 20(c) each of paragraph (a) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said City, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the City Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of said City. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and

contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said City Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds, are hereby delegated to the City Treasurer, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct the sale, and award the bonds in such manner as the City Treasurer shall deem best for the interests of said City; provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers, the City Treasurer shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds. The receipt of the City Treasurer shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser of such bonds, who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 7. All other matters, except as provided herein relating to such bonds herein authorized including date, denominations, maturities, interest payment dates, and whether said bonds shall be repaid in accordance with a schedule providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the City Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of such City. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the City Treasurer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 8. This ordinance shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this ordinance, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 9. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said City is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this bond ordinance are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 10. This ordinance, which takes effect immediately upon the adoption thereof, shall be published in summary form in the official newspaper of said City, together with a notice of the City Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

WHEREAS, according to the City of Lockport Code, the following special uses are allowed in an RA zone: (A) Parks, golf courses, athletic fields and other similar uses; (B) Essential Services; (C) Land reclamation operations other than refuse and garbage landfills; and (D) Cemeteries, and

WHEREAS, on June 13, 2019 and June 18, 2019, Cazenovia Recovery Systems held two public forums to address resident concerns and at the public forum Suzanne Bissonette, CEO of Cazenovia, stated that the project would need to be re-zoned R-3, and

WHEREAS, a rezoning involves a review of the City's master plan (comprehensive plan) which presently calls for the area to be zoned park land, and

WHEREAS, the type of housing proposed by LHC Holdings, LLC and Cazenovia Recovery System is subject to the Federal Fair Housing Act and other Federal Laws, and

WHEREAS, many group homes, which include residential drug treatment facilities, cannot be excluded in single-family residential neighborhoods simply because of the nature of the people being served and while municipalities can exercise its authority to regulate land use it cannot be stricter than it would with people who are not disabled, and

WHEREAS, it is important that the City adhere to the laws that prohibit discrimination of disabled individuals and group homes, and

WHEREAS, the City has in past retained outside counsel to assist the Office of the Corporation Counsel for complex matters such as the above proposed annexation, zoning and land development, and

WHEREAS, Daniel A. Spitzer, Esq. is a partner of Hodgson Russ LLP with many years of experience in planning and zoning, land use issues, real estate development and related municipal issues, and

WHEREAS, the City retained Mr. Spitzer several years ago to assist with the legal issues involving the environmental remediation and historic registry compliance for the Canal Street development, and

WHEREAS, the Common Council desires to retain the professional services of Mr. Spitzer to assist the Office of the Corporation Counsel with the complex issues involved with the above site.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that Corporation Counsel be and is hereby authorized and directed to enter into an engagement agreement with Mr. Spitzer for professional service for the Davison Road site.

Whereas, LHC Holdings, LLC, the sole owner of 360 Davison Road, Lockport, New York (the "Property"), submitted a Petition pursuant to Article 17 of the General Municipal Law to the City of Lockport and to the Town of Lockport seeking the annexation of the Town portion of the Property into the City (the "Annexation"); and

Whereas, the City and Town held a duly noticed joint public hearing on the Petition on May 15, 2019 at 5:30 p.m. at Lockport City Hall, One Locks Plaza, Lockport, New York; and

Whereas, the Common Council has considered the Petition and its supporting documentation, including the Short-Form Environmental Assessment Form ("EAF"), the comments of the public, and such other information as it deemed appropriate; now therefore be it

RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF CITY OF LOCKPORT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Council finds that the Petition meets the requirements of the Municipal Annexation Law, except for the concern as it relates to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) as noted herein. The Petition properly describes the proposed Annexation area, states the assessed valuation and population of the subject area and has been certified by the Assessors of the City and the Town.
- 2. The main question before the Council is whether the proposed annexation is or is not in the over-all public interest (1) of the territory proposed to be annexed, or (2) of the local government or governments to which the territory is proposed to be annexed, or (3) of the remaining area of the local government or governments in which such territory is situated, or (4) of any school district, fire district or other district corporation, public benefit corporation, fire protection district, fire alarm district or town or county

improvement district, situated wholly or partly in the territory proposed to be annexed. General Municipal Law § 705 (1)(e).

Overall public interest involves a number of factors, which, here, include the benefits and costs to the City and the City neighborhood in question, tax revenues potentially gained and lost by the City and Town, the ability to provide municipal services including police and fire protection, sewer and water service, public utilities, and the planning aspects of the annexation. The Council in particular notes the importance of how the City and Town community would be affected by bringing in this one parcel. As one New York Appellate Court has stated as "a cautionary note"

Piecemeal annexation, benefiting one property owner alone, may well result ultimately in municipal boundaries not in accordance with proper planning criteria. Hence, wherever possible, annexation should not follow the fortuitous boundary lines of the land of a single owner who seeks immediate advantage to himself, but the broader lines of divisions based on the planning aspects of the annexation.

In Matter of Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Vil. of Warwick v. Town Bd. of the Town of Warwick, 56 A.D. 2d 928, 928-9 (2d Dept. 1977).

The Property consists mainly of the former Niagara County Infirmary complex, with some public services already provided to the whole site by the City. The municipal boundary runs through the complex, which was recently sold by the County to the current owner. The Property is zoned Reserve Area District under Article XIV of the City Zoning Code. That Article contains two sections:

# § 190-76 Purpose

The purpose of the RA District is to delineate those areas where substantial development of the land in the form of buildings or structures is prohibited due to:

- A. Special or unusual conditions of topography, drainage, floodplain or other natural conditions, whereby considerable damage to buildings or structures and possible loss of life may occur due to the process of nature.
- B. The lack of proper facilities or improvements resulting in the land not being suitable for development at the present time and where such facilities or improvements must be taken on an areawide rather than individual parcel basis in order to serve adequately the area at a reasonable cost to the City.
- § 190-77 Special uses.

Special uses in the RA District shall be as follows:

- A. Parks, golf courses, athletic fields and other similar uses.
- B. Essential services.
- C. Land reclamation operations other than refuse and garbage landfill.
- D. Cemeteries.

The zoning was put in place by the 1984 Code adoption. In 1998, the City adopted the City of Lockport Comprehensive Plan. In regard to the RA Reserve District, the plan recommended (at p. 69) "review the RA Reserve Area (Article XIV) district regulations to ensure their fit with the completed Comprehensive Plan but retain this district as one which is clearly appropriate to the City's unique topographical and geological conditions." This has not been done, but the Council recognizes that as implied in § 190-76, the time may be at hand to reconsider the RA Reserve classification. One of the two municipalities having sole authority over an important community asset may well be best in the future.

But the record before the Council does not support an Annexation intended as a clear step to the redevelopment of the long-vacant property in a manner contrary to the current zoning and Comprehensive Plan. There is scant evidence of benefit to the City and Town or their specific neighborhoods, and in fact the Annexation appears to conflict with the recreational and suburban residential uses that have developed in the two municipalities around the site. Transfer of revenue from the Town to the City may be minor, but the costs to the City of servicing a built-out Project, may outweigh any benefit. Project approval would be streamlined but is not precluded, whether by rezoning or other means in each community. On this record Annexation does not appear to be in the overall public interest.

3. In regard to SEQRA, the Council has significant concerns. Specifically, the Short-Form EAF submitted with the application is inadequate for the review of the proposed annexation. On the issue of the required review under SEQRA for an annexation, the Court of Appeals has stated:

Since the annexation proposal lacks a specific project plan that has been officially submitted or a rezoning proposal that changes the use for which the property may be utilized, the EAF will necessarily be limited to the annexation itself and its effects. Where, on the other hand, an annexation is premised upon a formal project plan, environmental review will be more

extensive and must address the specific use of the property in evaluating the related environmental effects.

City Council v. Town Bd., 3 N.Y.3d 508, 520-1, n. 11, (2004). In this case, while the Property owner has not submitted zoning applications to the City, it has discussed and circulated plans for the Property to the community and discussed options for development. A potential significant user of the Property has held informational meetings with City and Town residents, based on constructing and operating a residential treatment center and 65 apartment units in the existing structures and new buildings.

As presented, the Petition, including the EAF, is inadequate because it does not present information addressing the environmental impacts of the potential development. The EAF simply refers to the annexation, disconnected from any project. But "annexation considerations cannot be segmented from the SEQRA analysis necessary for the whole action." *Taxpayers Opposed to Floodmart v. City of Hornell Indus. Dev. Agency*, 212 A.D.2d 958, 959 (4th Dep't 1995) (quoting the SEQR Handbook, at 105 [Nov. 1992 ed]. In the absence of information on the impacts, the City cannot meet its obligations under SEQRA without illegally segmenting the environmental review, nor can it agree that the proposed annexation is in the overall best interests of the public. For example, in the absence of detailed information on the proposed project, the Council cannot fully determine what tax revenues may be raised, what tax exemptions may apply, and the impact on the Town in terms of revenues lost and the City in terms of potential revenues gained and expenses that would be incurred.

- 4. Accordingly, it is Resolved and Ordered by the Common Council of the City of Lockport that the proposed Annexation is not in the over-all public interest and therefore the Petition is denied.
- 5. The City Clerk shall file a copy of this Resolution and Order with the Town Clerk of the Town of Lockport

Whereas, on August 2, 2017, the City of Lockport authorized the Mayor to sign an agreement with GHD Consulting Services Inc. for Professional Engineering Services to design the steel lock bar replacement by Resolution 080217.10, and

Whereas, on May 2, 2018 the City of Lockport passed Resolution 050218.5 to amend the Engineering Agreement with GHD due to the addition of further engineering design and construction phase services to include the replacement of the existing 24-inch water main on Summit Street in order to improve water distribution in the industrial area located on the west side of the City; and

Whereas, on December 20, 2018 the City of Lockport passed Resolution 121918.6 to amend the Engineering Agreement with GHD due to the addition of further engineering design and construction phase services to include various regulatory permit requirements, a wetland

delineation study, a revised joint application, an Erosion and Sediment Control Plan, a revised bypass design to optimize material reuse, a second project bidding process, and various easement and access related efforts with the Town of Lockport and National Grid; and

Whereas, on December 20<sup>th</sup>, 2018 the City of Lockport passed Resolution 121918.5 to authorize and direct the Mayor to sign a contract with Kandey Company, Inc., 19 Ransier Drive, West Seneca NY 14224 for the replacement of approximately two-mile section of steel lock bar pipe of the raw waterline in the amount of a not to exceed cost of \$6,712,145.00 to be charged to the NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation grant and loan awarded to the City through the New York State Water Infrastructure Improvement Act Grant Program and the New York State Revolving Fund Program; and

Whereas, GHD Consulting Services Inc. and the City of Lockport have determined that additional construction work is required to replace approximately 120 feet of original raw waterline on City property at the Water Treatment Plant which was not included in the project, but the extent of which is now understood, and poses a risk to the newly completed raw waterline, and to replace the existing underground vault, conduits and Venturi meter, which has failed previously, with a magnetic meter; and

Whereas, GHD Consulting Services, Inc. has reviewed this additional construction work and recommends the City authorize the additional work at a not-to exceed cost of \$300,000.00 to replace approximately 120 feet of original raw waterline and to replace the existing Venturi meter, concrete vault and associated power/signal conduits; and

Whereas, Kandey Company has requested an extension of time to its contract with the City, due to various construction related challenges and for the new work requested by the City, to a new contract completion date of November 15, 2019, and

Whereas, GHD Consulting Services Inc. has submitted a proposal for Professional Engineering Services to provide design, construction administration and resident inspection engineering services for the additional improvements and extended project schedule; now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the 2018-2019 State Budget included a requirement that all employers adopt and provide sexual harassment prevention policy to all employees; and

WHEREAS, New York State provided a "Model Policy" that contains the minimum standards required by the law; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport adopted the New York State "Model Policy" in October 2018 and subsequently amended the "Model Policy" by adopting the Employee Handbook in November 2018. Now therefore be it,

RESOLVED, that the following Sexual Harassment Policy be and is hereby adopted by the City of Lockport:

# CITY OF LOCKPORT SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICY

The City of Lockport is committed to maintaining a workplace free from sexual harassment. Sexual harassment is a form of workplace discrimination. All employees are required to work in a manner that prevents sexual harassment in the workplace. This Policy is one component of the City of Lockport's commitment to a discrimination-free work environment. Sexual harassment is against the law¹ and all employees have a legal right to a workplace free from sexual harassment and employees are urged to report sexual harassment by filing a complaint internally with the City of Lockport. Employees can also file a complaint with a government agency or in court under federal, state or local antidiscrimination laws.

# Policy:

- 1. *The City of Lockport's* policy applies to all employees, applicants for employment, interns, whether paid or unpaid, contractors and persons conducting business, regardless of immigration status, with *the City of Lockport*. In the remainder of this document, the term "employees" refers to this collective group.
- 2. Sexual harassment will not be tolerated. Any employee or individual covered by this policy who engages in sexual harassment or retaliation will be subject to remedial and/or disciplinary action (e.g., counseling, suspension, termination).
- 3. Retaliation Prohibition: No person covered by this Policy shall be subject to adverse action because the employee reports an incident of sexual harassment, provides information, or otherwise assists in any investigation of a sexual harassment complaint. The City of Lockport will not tolerate such retaliation against anyone who, in good faith, reports or provides information about suspected sexual harassment. Any employee of the City of Lockport who retaliates against anyone involved in a sexual harassment investigation will be subjected to disciplinary action, up to and including termination. All employees, paid or unpaid interns, or non-employees<sup>2</sup> working in the workplace who believe they have been subject to

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> While this policy specifically addresses sexual harassment, harassment because of and discrimination against persons of all protected classes is prohibited. In New York State, such classes includeage, race, creed, color, national origin, sexual orientation, military status, sex, disability, marital status, domestic violence victim status, gender identity and criminal history.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> A non-employee is someone who is (or is employed by) a contractor, subcontractor, vendor, consultant, or anyone providing services in the workplace. Protected non-employees include persons commonly referred to as independent contractors, "gig" workers and temporary workers. Also included are persons providing equipment repair, cleaning services or any other services provided pursuant to a contract with the employer.

such retaliation should inform a supervisor, manager, *Personnel Director*, or *Corporation Counsel*. All employees, paid or unpaid interns or non-employees who believe they have been a target of such retaliation may also seek relief in other available forums, as explained below in the section on Legal Protections.

- 4. Sexual harassment is offensive, is a violation of our policies, is unlawful, and may subject *the City of Lockport* to liability for harm to targets of sexual harassment. Harassers may also be individually subject to liability. Employees of every level who engage in sexual harassment, including managers and supervisors who engage in sexual harassment or who allow such behavior to continue, will be penalized for such misconduct.
- 5. The City of Lockport will conduct a prompt and thorough investigation that ensures due process for all parties, whenever management receives a complaint about sexual harassment, or otherwise knows of possible sexual harassment occurring. The City of Lockport will keep the investigation confidential to the extent possible. Effective corrective action will be taken whenever sexual harassment is found to have occurred. All employees, including managers and supervisors, are required to cooperate with any internal investigation of sexual harassment.
- 6. All employees are encouraged to report any harassment or behaviors that violate this policy. *The City of Lockport* will provide all employees a complaint form for employees to report harassment and file complaints.
- 7. Managers and supervisors are **required** to report any complaint that they receive, or any harassment that they observe or become aware of, to *the Personnel Director or Corporation Counsel's Office*.
- 8. This policy applies to all employees, paid or unpaid interns, and non-employees and all must follow and uphold this policy. This policy must be provided to all employees and should be posted prominently in all work locations to the extent practicable (for example, in a main office, not an offsite work location) and be provided to employees upon hiring.

# What Is "Sexual Harassment"?

Sexual harassment is a form of sex discrimination and is unlawful under federal, state, and (where applicable) local law. Sexual harassment includes harassment on the basis of sex, sexual orientation, self-identified or perceived sex, gender expression, gender identity and the status of being transgender.

Sexual harassment includes unwelcome conduct which is either of a sexual nature, or which is directed at an individual because of that individual's sex when:

• Such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive work

environment, even if the reporting individual is not the intended target of the sexual harassment:

- Such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of employment; or
- Submission to or rejection of such conduct is used as the basis for employment decisions affecting an individual's employment.

A sexually harassing hostile work environment includes, but is not limited to, words, signs, jokes, pranks, intimidation or physical violence which are of a sexual nature, or which are directed at an individual because of that individual's sex. Sexual harassment also consists of any unwanted verbal or physical advances, sexually explicit derogatory statements or sexually discriminatory remarks made by someone which are offensive or objectionable to the recipient, which cause the recipient discomfort or humiliation, which interfere with the recipient's job performance.

Sexual harassment also occurs when a person in authority tries to trade job benefits for sexual favors. This can include hiring, promotion, continued employment or any other terms, conditions or privileges of employment. This is also called "quid pro quo" harassment.

Any employee who feels harassed should report so that any violation of this policy can be corrected promptly. Any harassing conduct, even a single incident, can be addressed under this policy.

# Examples of sexual harassment

The following describes some of the types of acts that may be unlawful sexual harassment and that are strictly prohibited:

- Physical acts of a sexual nature, such as:
  - o Touching, pinching, patting, kissing, hugging, grabbing, brushing against another employee's body or poking another employee's body;
  - o Rape, sexual battery, molestation or attempts to commit these assaults.
- Unwanted sexual advances or propositions, such as:
  - Requests for sexual favors accompanied by implied or overt threats concerning the target's job performance evaluation, a promotion or other job benefits or detriments;
  - o Subtle or obvious pressure for unwelcome sexual activities.
- Sexually oriented gestures, noises, remarks or jokes, or comments about a person's sexuality or sexual experience, which create a hostile work environment.

- Sex stereotyping occurs when conduct or personality traits are considered inappropriate simply because they may not conform to other people's ideas or perceptions about how individuals of a particular sex should act or look.
- Sexual or discriminatory displays or publications anywhere in the workplace, such as:
  - Displaying pictures, posters, calendars, graffiti, objects, promotional material, reading materials or other materials that are sexually demeaning or pornographic. This includes such sexual displays on workplace computers or cell phones and sharing such displays while in the workplace.
- Hostile actions taken against an individual because of that individual's sex, sexual orientation, gender identity and the status of being transgender, such as:
  - Interfering with, destroying or damaging a person's workstation, tools or equipment, or otherwise interfering with the individual's ability to perform the job;
  - Sabotaging an individual's work;
  - o Bullying, yelling, name-calling.

# Who can be a target of sexual harassment?

Sexual harassment can occur between any individuals, regardless of their sex or gender. New York Law protects employees, paid or unpaid interns, and non-employees, including independent contractors, and those employed by companies contracting to provide services in the workplace. Harassers can be a superior, a subordinate, a coworker or anyone in the workplace including an independent contractor, contract worker, vendor, client, customer or visitor.

# Where can sexual harassment occur?

Unlawful sexual harassment is not limited to the physical workplace itself. It can occur while employees are traveling for business or at employer sponsored events or parties. Calls, texts, emails, and social media usage by employees can constitute unlawful workplace harassment, even if they occur away from the workplace premises, on personal devices or during non-work hours.

# Retaliation

Unlawful retaliation can be any action that could discourage a worker from coming forward to make or support a sexual harassment claim. Adverse action need not be jobrelated or occur in the workplace to constitute unlawful retaliation (e.g., threats of physical violence outside of work hours).

Such retaliation is unlawful under federal, state, and (where applicable) local law. The New York State Human Rights Law protects any individual who has engaged in "protected activity." Protected activity occurs when a person has:

- made a complaint of sexual harassment, either internally or with any antidiscrimination agency;
- testified or assisted in a proceeding involving sexual harassment under the Human Rights Law or other anti-discrimination law;
- opposed sexual harassment by making a verbal or informal complaint to management, or by simply informing a supervisor or manager of harassment;
- reported that another employee has been sexually harassed; or
- encouraged a fellow employee to report harassment.

Even if the alleged harassment does not turn out to rise to the level of a violation of law, the individual is protected from retaliation if the person had a good faith belief that the practices were unlawful. However, the retaliation provision is not intended to protect persons making intentionally false charges of harassment.

# **Reporting Sexual Harassment**

Preventing sexual harassment is everyone's responsibility. The City of Lockport cannot prevent or remedy sexual harassment unless it knows about it. Any employee, paid or unpaid intern or non-employee who has been subjected to behavior that may constitute sexual harassment is encouraged to report such behavior to a supervisor, manager, Personnel Director, or Corporation Counsel's Office. Anyone who witnesses or becomes aware of potential instances of sexual harassment should report such behavior to a supervisor, manager, Personnel Director, or Corporation Counsel's Office.

Reports of sexual harassment may be made verbally or in writing. A form for submission of a written complaint is attached to this Policy, and all employees are encouraged to use this complaint form. Employees who are reporting sexual harassment on behalf of other employees should use the complaint form and note that it is on another employee's behalf.

Employees, paid or unpaid interns or non-employees who believe they have been a target of sexual harassment may also seek assistance in other available forums, as explained below in the section on Legal Protections.

## **Supervisory Responsibilities**

All supervisors and managers who receive a complaint or information about suspected sexual harassment, observe what may be sexually harassing behavior or for any reason suspect that sexual harassment is occurring, **are required** to report such suspected sexual harassment to the *Personnel Director or Corporation Counsel's Office*.

In addition to being subject to discipline if they engaged in sexually harassing conduct themselves, supervisors and managers will be subject to discipline for failing to report suspected sexual harassment or otherwise knowingly allowing sexual harassment to continue.

Supervisors and managers will also be subject to discipline for engaging in any retaliation.

# Complaint and Investigation of Sexual Harassment

*All* complaints or information about sexual harassment will be investigated, whether that information was reported in verbal or written form. Investigations will be conducted in a timely manner, and will be confidential to the extent possible.

An investigation of any complaint, information or knowledge of suspected sexual harassment will be prompt and thorough, commenced immediately and completed as soon as possible. The investigation will be kept confidential to the extent possible. All persons involved, including complainants, witnesses and alleged harassers will be accorded due process, as outlined below, to protect their rights to a fair and impartial investigation.

Any employee may be required to cooperate as needed in an investigation of suspected sexual harassment. *The City of Lockport* will not tolerate retaliation against employees who file complaints, support another's complaint or participate in an investigation regarding a violation of this policy.

While the process may vary from case to case, investigations should be done in accordance with the following steps:

- Upon receipt of complaint, the Personnel Director or Corporation Counsel's Office will conduct an immediate review of the allegations, and take any interim actions (e.g., instructing the respondent to refrain from communications with the complainant), as appropriate. If complaint is verbal, encourage the individual to complete the "Complaint Form" in writing. If he or she refuses, prepare a Complaint Form based on the verbal reporting.
- If documents, emails or phone records are relevant to the investigation, take steps to obtain and preserve them.
- Request and review all relevant documents, including all electronic communications.
- Interview all parties involved, including any relevant witnesses;
- Create a written documentation of the investigation (such as a letter, memo or email), which contains the following:
  - A list of all documents reviewed, along with a detailed summary of relevant documents;
  - A list of names of those interviewed, along with a detailed summary of their statements;

- o A timeline of events;
- o A summary of prior relevant incidents, reported or unreported; and
- The basis for the decision and final resolution of the complaint, together with any corrective action(s).
- Keep the written documentation and associated documents in a secure and confidential location.
- Promptly notify the individual who reported and the individual(s) about whom the complaint was made of the final determination and implement any corrective actions identified in the written document.
- Inform the individual who reported of the right to file a complaint or charge externally as outlined in the next section.

# **Legal Protections And External Remedies**

Sexual harassment is not only prohibited by *the City of Lockport* but is also prohibited by state, federal, and, where applicable, local law.

Aside from the internal process at *the City of Lockport* employees may also choose to pursue legal remedies with the following governmental entities. While a private attorney is not required to file a complaint with a governmental agency, you may seek the legal advice of an attorney.

In addition to those outlined below, employees in certain industries may have additional legal protections.

# **State Human Rights Law (HRL)**

The Human Rights Law (HRL), codified as N.Y. Executive Law, art. 15, § 290 et seq., applies to all employers in New York State with regard to sexual harassment, and protects employees, paid or unpaid interns and non-employees, regardless of immigration status. A complaint alleging violation of the Human Rights Law may be filed either with the Division of Human Rights (DHR) or in New York State Supreme Court.

Complaints with DHR may be filed any time **within one year** of the harassment. If an individual did not file at DHR, they can sue directly in state court under the HRL, **within three years** of the alleged sexual harassment. An individual may not file with DHR if they have already filed a HRL complaint in state court.

Complaining internally to *the City of Lockport* does not extend your time to file with DHR or in court. The one year or three years is counted from date of the most recent incident of harassment.

You do not need an attorney to file a complaint with DHR, and there is no cost to file with DHR.

DHR will investigate your complaint and determine whether there is probable cause to believe that sexual harassment has occurred. Probable cause cases are forwarded to a public hearing before an administrative law judge. If sexual harassment is found after a hearing, DHR has the power to award relief, which varies but may include requiring your employer to take action to stop the harassment, or redress the damage caused, including paying of monetary damages, attorney's fees and civil fines.

The website has a complaint form that can be downloaded, filled out, notarized and mailed to DHR. The website also contains contact information for DHR's regional offices across New York State.

## Civil Rights Act of 1964

The United States Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) enforces federal anti-discrimination laws, including Title VII of the 1964 federal Civil Rights Act (codified as 42 U.S.C. § 2000e et seq.). An individual can file a complaint with the EEOC anytime within 300 days from the harassment. There is no cost to file a complaint with the EEOC. The EEOC will investigate the complaint, and determine whether there is reasonable cause to believe that discrimination has occurred, at which point the EEOC will issue a Right to Sue letter permitting the individual to file a complaint in federal court.

The EEOC does not hold hearings or award relief, but may take other action including pursuing cases in federal court on behalf of complaining parties. Federal courts may award remedies if discrimination is found to have occurred. In general, private employers must have at least 15 employees to come within the jurisdiction of the EEOC.

An employee alleging discrimination at work can file a "Charge of Discrimination." The EEOC has district, area, and field offices where complaints can be filed. Contact the EEOC by calling 1-800-669-4000 (TTY: 1-800-669-6820), visiting their website at www.eeoc.gov or via email at info@eeoc.gov.

If an individual filed an administrative complaint with DHR, DHR will file the complaint with the EEOC to preserve the right to proceed in federal court.

# **Local Protections**

Many localities enforce laws protecting individuals from sexual harassment and discrimination. An individual should contact the county, city or town in which they live to find out if such a law exists. For example, employees who work in New York City may file complaints of sexual harassment with the New York City Commission on Human Rights. Contact their main office at Law Enforcement Bureau of the NYC Commission on Human Rights, 40 Rector Street, 10th Floor, New York, New York; call 311 or (212) 306-7450; or visit <a href="https://www.nyc.gov/html/cchr/html/home/home.shtml">www.nyc.gov/html/cchr/html/home/home.shtml</a>.

# **Contact the Local Police Department**

If the harassment involves unwanted physical touching, coerced physical confinement or coerced sex acts, the conduct may constitute a crime. Contact the local police department.

BOND ORDINANCE DATED AUGUST 21, 2019.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$675,000 BONDS OF THE CITY OF LOCKPORT, NIAGARA COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF THE REPLACEMENT OF THE CLARIFIER MECHANISM AT THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT, IN AND FOR SAID CITY.

WHEREAS, the capital project hereinafter described has been determined to be a Type II Action pursuant to the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, the implementation of which as proposed, such regulations provide, will not result in any significant adverse environmental impact; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize the financing thereof, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the Common Council of the City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The replacement of the clarifier mechanism at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, in and for the City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, including incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$675,000.

Section 2. It is hereby determined that the plan for the financing of said specific object or purpose is by the issuance of \$675,000 bonds of said City hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. It is hereby further determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is forty years, pursuant to subdivision 4 of paragraph (a) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said City, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the City Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of said City. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said City Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds, are hereby delegated to the City Treasurer, who shall advertise such bonds for sale, conduct the sale, and award the bonds in such manner as the City Treasurer shall deem best for the interests of said City, including, but not limited to, the power to sell said bonds to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation; provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers, the City Treasurer shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds. The receipt of the City Treasurer shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser of such bonds, who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 7. All other matters, except as provided herein relating to such bonds herein authorized including date, denominations, maturities, interest payment dates, and whether said bonds shall be repaid in accordance with a schedule providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service,

within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the City Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of such City. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the City Treasurer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 8. The City Treasurer is hereby further authorized, at her sole discretion, to execute a project finance and loan agreement, and any other agreements with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and/or the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation, including amendments thereto, and including any instruments (or amendments thereto) in the effectuation thereof, in order to effect the financing or refinancing of the specific object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof, or a portion thereof, by a bond, and/or note issue of said City in the event of the sale of same to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation.

Section 9. The power to issue and sell notes for said specific object or purpose to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation pursuant to Section 169.00 of the Local Finance Law is hereby delegated to the City Treasurer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents as may be prescribed by said City Treasurer consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 10. This ordinance shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this ordinance, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

<u>Section 11.</u> The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said City is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this bond ordinance are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 12. This ordinance, which takes effect immediately upon the adoption thereof, shall be published in summary form in the official newspaper of said City, together with a notice of the City Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

and received two proposals on June 28, 2019 for the requested Scope of Work, which were publically opened and read allowed as follows: Hunt Engineers \$237,403.00, and Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc\$169,700.00; and

BOND ORDINANCE DATED SEPTEMBER 4, 2019.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,125,000 BONDS OF THE CITY OF LOCKPORT, NIAGARA COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF THE EFFLUENT DISINFECTION UPGRADE PROJECT AT THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT, IN AND FOR SAID CITY.

WHEREAS, the capital project hereinafter described has been determined to be a Type II Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.5(c)(1) and (2) of the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, the implementation of which as proposed, such regulations provide, will not result in any significant adverse environmental impact; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize the financing thereof, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the Common Council of the City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The effluent disinfection upgrade project at the Wastewater Treatment Plant, in and for the City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, including original furnishings, equipment, apparatus, appurtenances, and incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$3,125,000.

Section 2. It is hereby determined that the plan for the financing of said specific object or purpose is by the issuance of \$3,125,000 bonds of said City hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law; **PROVIDED**, **HOWEVER**, that to the extent that any Federal or State grants-in-aid are received for such specific object or purpose, the amount of bonds to be issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be reduced dollar for dollar.

Section 3. It is hereby further determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is forty years, pursuant to subdivision 4 of paragraph (a) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. The faith and credit of said City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property of said City, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the City Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of said City. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said City Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. The powers and duties of advertising such bonds for sale, conducting the sale and awarding the bonds, are hereby delegated to the City Treasurer, who shall advertise such bonds for sale,

conduct the sale, and award the bonds in such manner as the City Treasurer shall deem best for the interests of said City, including, but not limited to, the power to sell said bonds to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation; provided, however, that in the exercise of these delegated powers, the City Treasurer shall comply fully with the provisions of the Local Finance Law and any order or rule of the State Comptroller applicable to the sale of municipal bonds. The receipt of the City Treasurer shall be a full acquittance to the purchaser of such bonds, who shall not be obliged to see to the application of the purchase money.

Section 7. All other matters, except as provided herein relating to such bonds herein authorized including date, denominations, maturities, interest payment dates, and whether said bonds shall be repaid in accordance with a schedule providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the City Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of such City. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the City Treasurer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 8. The City Treasurer is hereby further authorized, at her sole discretion, to execute a project finance and loan agreement, and any other agreements with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and/or the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation, including amendments thereto, and including any instruments (or amendments thereto) in the effectuation thereof, in order to effect the financing or refinancing of the specific object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof, or a portion thereof, by a bond, and/or note issue of said City in the event of the sale of same to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation.

Section 9. The power to issue and sell notes for said specific object or purpose to the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation pursuant to Section 169.00 of the Local Finance Law is hereby delegated to the City Treasurer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents as may be prescribed by said City Treasurer consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 10. This ordinance shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this ordinance, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

<u>Section 11.</u> The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said City is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this bond ordinance are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 12. This ordinance, which takes effect immediately upon the adoption thereof, shall be published in summary form in the official newspaper of said City, together with a notice of the City Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Lockport as follows:

- 1. The attached Local Law Establishing a Moratorium on Approval in the RA Reserve District, for a Period of 6 Months, is hereby adopted, and shall take effect upon filing with the New York Secretary of State.
  - 2. This Resolution shall be effective immediately.

# **LOCAL LAW NO. 1 - 2019**

A local law establishing a moratorium on approvals in the RA Reserve District, for a period of 6 months

Be it hereby enacted by the Common Council of the City of Lockport as follows:

## SECTION I. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS.

The Common Council of the City of Lockport has recently reviewed a Petition for annexation of the Town of Lockport portion of 360 Davison Road into the City. The zoning of that property was put in place by the 1984 Code adoption. In 1998, the City adopted the City of Lockport Comprehensive Plan. In regard to the RA Reserve District, the plan recommended (at p. 69) "review the RA Reserve Area (Article XIV) district regulations to ensure their fit with the completed Comprehensive Plan but retain this district as one which is clearly appropriate to the City's unique topographical and geological conditions." This has not been done and Council believes the Plan and Code should be immediately reviewed, and that the recent sale of the former County Infirmary makes time of the essence. The Council further believes the review should be a joint City-Town exercise, to ensure the values of the joint community are represented.

# **SECTION II APPLICABILITY**

- 1. For a period of six months from the effective date of this Local Law, no Zoning application for an approval under Chapter 190 of the City Code for property in the RA Reserve District shall be approved by any board with appropriate authority in the City of Lockport, including but not limited to the City Council, Planning Board or Zoning Board of Appeals, nor shall any approval or permit be issued by any official of the City of Lockport.
- 2. During the pendency of this moratorium, any party may submit an application for any approval, and the application, including any required referrals and public hearings, shall be processed in accordance with the City Code unless the applicant agrees to delay such review during the pendency of this Moratorium, however no decision shall be rendered.
- 3. Nothing in this Local Law shall suspend 1) the right of any party who has obtained a building permit prior to the effective date of this Local Law from continuing with any construction allowable under said permit, or 2) the right of any party who has obtained all approvals except a building permit prior to the effective date of this Local Law from obtaining a building permit and commencing any construction allowable under said permit.

#### **SECTION III APPEAL PROVISIONS**

1/2/19

The City Council shall have the power to vary or modify the application of any provision of this local law upon its determination, in its absolute legislative discretion, after public hearing or notice, that this local law would impose extraordinary hardship upon a landowner, and that a variance from this act will not adversely affect the health, safety and general welfare of the town. Any request for an exception or variance shall be filed with City Clerk, and shall include a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the processing of such application. All such applications shall be promptly referred to the Planning Board for a recommendation, and shall thereafter be remanded to the City Council for a public hearing and final decision.

# SECTION IV REVIEW OF THE RA RESERVE DISTRICT

The Common Council hereby directs that a review of the RA Reserve District be undertaken by the Community Development Department, with consideration of updating the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Code as potential outcomes. Further, the Council directs that the Town of Lockport should be invited to participate in the review, as a joint review is appropriate in a district where the municipal boundary runs through the subject properties.

## **SECTION V PENALTIES**

Any person, firm, entity or corporation that shall violate the terms and provisions of this Local Law shall be subject to a penalty in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1000.00) for each day such violation shall exist.

# **SECTION VI VALIDITY**

The invalidity of a word, section, clause, paragraph, sentence, or part of provision of this local law shall not affect the validity of any other part of this local law that can be given effect without such invalid part or parts.

## **SECTION VII EFFECTIVE DATE**

This law shall take effect immediately, as provided by the law, upon filing with the Secretary of State and shall remain in force and effect for a period six months from its effective date.

WHEREAS, on October 7, 2014, Mayor Anne E. McCaffrey was forced to lay off 9 employees – an administrative coordinator, a clerk in the police department, a senior account clerk in the treasurer's office, a public works supervisor, a highways and parks employee, a deputy corporation counsel and three laborers, and

WHEREAS, in 2014 the City of Lockport got out of the ambulance business due to a reoccurring annual operating loss from ambulance services of \$1.2 million dollars, and

WHEREAS, the cost for the City of Lockport to get back into the ambulance service is estimated to be \$1.5 million, and

WHEREAS, as a result of getting out of providing ambulance service the City reduced the number of firemen for the 3 shifts from 9 to 6, and

WHEREAS through the employee reductions and the replacement of paid ambulance service with an independent ambulance service, as well as other measures, the City of Lockport was able to avoid insolvency, eliminate the previously accumulated \$4 million deficit and adequately fund operations for fiscal years 2014 through 2019, and

WHEREAS the fiscal restructuring that was accomplished enabled the City of Lockport to significantly upgrade its credit rating with both Moody's and Standard and Poor's, and restore fiscal stability and confidence, and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2019, an arbitrator, appointed by the New York State Public Employees Relations Board, ruled that the City violated the Lockport Professional Firefighter's Association Collective Bargaining Agreement by reducing minimum manning per shift from 9 to 6, and

WHERAS, the arbitrator found that the residents and firefighters would be safer with hiring 12 more firemen, and

WHEREAS, on August 10, 2016, the City of Lockport Fire Department with the assistance of mutual aid from 40 neighboring fire companies and 200 firefighters from three counties successfully battled a massive fire at High Tread International – the largest fire in the City's history --with 6-man minimum manning without any injuries to residents or fireman, and

WHEREAS, mutual aid has provided the necessary back up support to our firefighters for years and there is no need to add 12 additional full-time firefighters to the City budget, and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport averages 4 to 23 structure fires a year, and

WHEREAS, the salary and benefits of just one City fireman is \$78,000 without including overtime and legacy costs and the estimated cost to add 12 more firemen exceeds 1.5 million dollars, and

WHEREAS, the annual reoccurring cost to the taxpayers to add 12 more firemen to the budget will exceed \$850,000 a year, and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport should file a motion to vacate the arbitrators decision on the basis that the decision is outside the scope of his authority and that there was no evidence introduced into the record to support a finding that staffing levels of 6 men per shift is unsafe and 12 more firemen must be hired immediately, and

WHEREAS, if the City fails to challenge the arbitrator's decision it will have no bargaining power to negotiate the implementation of the arbitrator's decision pending the appeal, and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost to challenge the arbitrator's decision is far less compared the millions of dollars the city will pay in salaries, benefits and legacy costs for 12 more firemen,

WHEREAS, to not challenge the decision borders on gross negligence, and

WHEREAS, the deadline to challenge the arbitrator's decision is December 7, 2019.

# **LOCAL LAW NO. 2 – 2019**

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT EMERGENCY SERVICE COST RECOVERY

#### PROGRAM ESTABLISHED

It is determined that it is reasonable and necessary to recover costs incurred by the City of Lockport Fire Department for the use of apparatus and equipment in the provision of emergency medical services which are deployed by the Lockport Fire Department. The cost recovery amounts provided for herein shall be charged to the insurance carrier of the rescued individual or entity. In no instance shall rescue and response services be denied for lack of an insurance carrier. The rates specified herein for recovery amounts may be amended from time to time, by resolution, by the Common Council.

- (A) Motor Vehicle Accident (Minor) \$150.00
  - (1) Minor spill control.
  - (2) Fire hazard precautions.
  - (3) Scene safety.

  - (1) Patient care/handling

  - (3) Emergency medical services provided for occupants located outside of the vehicle
- (D) Heavy Rescue \$600.00
  - (1) Use of hydraulic, pneumatic or power tools to extricate patient.
  - (2) Multiple patient removal/ treatment.
- (E) Hazardous Materials Control \$1000.00
  Incidents involving commercial trucks, vans, or motor carriers where products have been spilled or released and require specialized equipment and personnel. In the event of a Department of Environmental Conservation incident, the responsible parties will be billed rather than insurance companies.
- (F) Destroyed or Contaminated Equipment The Full Cost of replacement of any and all equipment that is destroyed or contaminated at the scene of a response or rescue is to be charged.
- (G) Fire Suppression \$300.00 Any fire involving automobiles, transportation or heavy equipment vehicles.

## City of Lockport Local Law No. 3 of the year 2019

## A local law amending the City of Lockport Hotel Occupancy Tax Law

Be it enacted by the Common Council of the City of Lockport as follows:

## SECTION 1 TITLE

This local law shall be known as the City of Lockport Hotel Occupancy Tax Law.

## SECTION 2 DEFINITIONS

When used in this enactment the following terms shall mean:

- "Hotel or Motel" A building or portion of it which is regularly used and kept open as such for the lodging of guests. The term "hotel" or "motel" includes an apartment hotel, a motel, boarding house or club, bed and breakfast, inns, and tourist homes, whether or not meals are served.
- "Occupancy" The use or possession, or the right to the use or possession, of any room in a hotel.
- "Occupant" A person who, for consideration, uses, possesses, or has the right to use or possess, any room in a hotel under any lease, concession, permit, right of access, license to use or other agreement, or otherwise.
- "Operator" Any person operating a hotel.
- "Permanent resident" Any occupant of any room or rooms in a hotel for at least ninety consecutive days shall be considered a permanent resident with regard to the period of such occupancy.
- "Rent" The consideration received for occupancy valued in money, whether received in money or otherwise.
- "Room" Any room or rooms of any kind in any part or portion of a hotel, which is available for or let out for any purpose other than a place of assembly.

# SECTION 3 IMPOSITION OF SALES TAX

On and after December 1, 2019, or as soon thereafter as the Governor approves the legislation, for a period of three years from the date of the enactment of this Local Law, there is hereby imposed and there shall be paid a tax of 5 percent upon the rent for every occupancy of a room or rooms in a hotel in this state, except that the tax shall not be imposed upon (1) a permanent resident, or (2) where the rent is not more than at the rate of two dollars per day.

The tax imposed herein shall be paid upon any occupancy on and after December 1, 2019, although such occupancy is pursuant to a prior contract, lease or other arrangement. Where rent is paid on a weekly, monthly or other term basis, the rent shall be subject to the tax imposed herein to the extent that it covers any period on and after December 1, 2019 and such rent shall be apportioned on the basis of the ratio of the number of days falling within said period to the total number of days covered thereby.

# SECTION 4 EXEMPT ORGINAZATIONS

Except as otherwise provided in this section, any occupancy by any of the following shall not be subject to the tax imposed under this enactment:

- (1) The State of New York, or any of its agencies, instrumentalities, public corporations (including a public corporation created pursuant to agreement of compact with another state or Canada) or political subdivisions where it is the purchaser, user or consumer, or where it is a vendor of services or property of a kind not ordinarily sold by private persons;
- (2) The United States of America, and any of its agencies and instrumentalities, insofar as it is immune from taxation where it is the purchaser, user or consumer, or where it sells services or property of a kind not ordinarily sold by private person;
- (3) The United Nations or any international organization of which the United States of America is a member where it is the purchaser, user or consumer, or where it sells services or property of a kind not ordinarily sold by private persons;
- (4) Any corporation, association, trust, or community chest, fund or foundation, organized and operated exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, testing for public safety, literary or educational purposes, or to foster national or international amateur sports competition (but only if no part of its activities involve the provision of athletic facilities or equipment), or for the prevention of cruelty to children or animals, no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual, no substantial part of the activities of which is carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, (except as otherwise provided in subsection (h) of section five hundred one of the United States internal revenue code of nineteen hundred fifty-four, as amended), and which does not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office;
- (5) A post or organization of past or present members of the armed forces of the United States, or an auxiliary unit or society of, or a trust or foundation for, any such post or organization:
  - (a) organized in this state,
  - (b) at least seventy-five percent of the members of which are past or present members of the armed forces of the United States and substantially all of the other members of which are individuals who are cadets or are spouses, widows, or widowers of past or present members of the armed forces of the United States or of cadets, and

- (c) no part of the net earnings of which inures to the benefit of any private shareholders or individual.
- (6) The following Indian nations or tribes residing in New York State: Cayuga, Oneida, Onondaga, Poospatuck, Saint Regis Mohawk, Seneca, Shinnecock, Tonawanda and Tuscarora, where it is the purchaser, user or consumer.
- (7) A not-for-profit corporation operating as a health maintenance organization subject to the provisions of article forty-four of the public health law.
- (8) Cooperative and foreign corporations doing business in this state pursuant to the rural electric cooperative law.

## SECTION 5 TERRITORIAL LIMITATIONS

Any tax imposed under the authority of this enactment shall apply only within the territorial limits of the City of Lockport except that any establishment located partially within the City of Lockport and partially within a town or towns and receiving any services or utilities provided by the City of Lockport shall be deemed to be wholly within the City of Lockport for the purposes of the taxes imposed herein.

# SECTION 6 REGISTRATION

Within ten days after the effective date of this local law or amendment, or in the case of operators commencing business after such effective date, within three days after such commencement or opening, every operator shall file with the City Clerk a certificate of registration in a form prescribed by the City Clerk. The City Clerk shall, within five days after such registration, issue, without charge to each operator, a certificate of authority empowering such operator to collect the tax from occupant and duplicate thereof for each additional hotel of such operator. Each certificate or duplicate shall state the hotel to which it is applicable. Such certificates of authority shall be prominently displayed by the operator in such manner that it may be seen and come to the notice of all occupants and persons seeking occupancy. Such Certificates shall be non-assignable and non-transferable and shall be surrendered immediately to the City Clerk upon the cessation of business at the hotel named or upon its sale or transfer.

# SECTION 7 ADMINISTRATION AND COLLECTION

- (1) The tax imposed by this local law shall be administered and collected by the City Treasurer.
- (2) The tax to be collected shall be stated and charged separately from the rent and shown separately on any record thereof, at the time when the occupancy is arranged or contracted for and charged for, and upon every evidence of occupancy or any bill or statement or charge made for said occupancy issued or delivered by the operator, and the tax shall be paid by the occupant to the operator as trustee for and on account of the City, and the operator shall be liable for the collection thereof and for the tax. The operator and any officer of any corporate operator shall be personally liable for the tax

collected or required to be collected under this local law, and the operator shall have the same right in respect to collecting the tax from the occupant, or in respect to non-payment of the tax by the occupant as if the tax were a part of the rent for the occupancy payable at the time such tax shall become due and owing, including all rights of eviction, dispossession, repossession and enforcement of any innkeeper's lien that he may have in the event of non-payment of rent by the occupant.

- (3) The City Treasurer may, wherever he deems it necessary for the proper enforcement of this local law, provide by regulation that the occupant shall file returns and pay directly to the City Treasurer the tax herein imposed, at such times as returns are required to be filed and payment over made by the operator.
- (4) For the purpose of the proper administration of this local law and to prevent evasion of the tax hereby imposed, it shall be presumed that all rents are subject to tax until the contrary is established, and the burden of proving that a rent for occupancy is not taxable hereunder shall be upon the operator or the occupant. Where an occupant claims exemptions from the tax under the provisions of section four hereof, the rent shall be deemed taxable hereunder unless the operator shall receive from the occupant claiming such exemption a copy of a certificate issued by the City Treasurer certifying that the corporation or association therein named is exempt from the tax under section four hereof, together with a certificate duly executed by the corporation or association named in the certificate of the City Treasurer certifying that the occupant is its agent, representative or employee and that his occupancy is paid or to be paid by, and is necessary or required in the course of or in connection with the affairs of said corporation or association.

# SECTION 8 RECORDS TO BE KEPT

Every operator shall keep records of every occupancy and of all rent paid, charged or due thereon and of the tax payable thereon, in such form as the City Treasurer may by regulation require. Such records shall be available for inspection and examination at any time upon demand by the City Treasurer or his duly authorized agent or employee and shall be preserved for a period of three years, except that the City Treasurer may consent to their destruction within that period or may require that they be kept longer.

## SECTION 9 RETURNS

- (1) Every operator shall file with the City Treasurer a return of occupancy and of rents, and of the taxes payable thereon for the periods ending March thirty-first, June thirtieth, September thirtieth, and December thirty-first of each year. Such returns shall be filed within twenty days from the expiration of the period covered thereby. The City Treasurer may permit or require returns to be made by other periods and upon such dates as he may specify. If the City Treasurer deems it necessary in order to insure the payment of the tax imposed by this local law, he may require returns to be made for shorter periods than those prescribed pursuant to the foregoing provisions of this section and upon such dates as he may specify.
- (2) The forms of returns shall be prescribed by the City Treasurer and shall contain such information as he may deem necessary for the proper administration of this local law.

- The City Treasurer may require amended returns to be filed within twenty days after notice and to contain the information specified in the notice.
- (3) If a return required by this local law is not filed, or if a return when filed is incorrect or insufficient on its face, the City Treasurer shall take the necessary steps to enforce the filing of such a return or of a corrected return.

## SECTION 10 PAYMENT OF TAX

At the time of filing a return of occupancy and of rents each operator shall pay to the City Treasurer the taxes imposed by this local law upon the rents required to be included in such return, as well as all other moneys collected by the operator acting or purporting to act under the provisions in this local law. Even though it be judicially determined that the tax collected is invalidly required to be filed, it shall be due from the operator and payable to the City Treasurer on the date limited for the filing of the return for such period, without regard to whether a return is filed or whether the return which is filed correctly shows the amount of rents and the taxes due thereon. Where the City Treasurer in his discretion deems it necessary to protect revenues to be obtained under this local law he may require any operator required to collect the tax imposed by this local law to file with him a bond, issued by a surety company authorized to transact business in this state and approved by the superintendent of insurance of this state as to the solvency and responsibility, in such amount as the City Treasurer may fix to secure the payment of any tax and/or penalties and interest due or which may become due from such operator. In the event that the City Treasurer determines that an operator is to file such bond he shall give notice to such operator to that effect specifying the amount of the bond required. The operator shall file such bond within five days after the giving of such notice unless within such five days the operator shall request in writing a hearing before the City Treasurer at which the necessity, propriety and amount of the bond shall be determined by the City Treasurer. Such determination shall be final and shall be complied with within fifteen days after the giving of notices thereof. In lieu of such bond, securities approved by the City Treasurer or case in such amount as he may prescribe may be deposited which shall be kept in the custody of the City Treasurer who may at any time without notice to the depositor apply them to any tax and/or interest or penalties due, and for that purpose the securities may be sold by him at public or private sale without notice to the depositor thereof.

# SECTION 11 DETERMINATION OF TAX

If a return required by this local law is not filed, or if a return when filed is incorrect or insufficient the amount of tax due shall be determined by the City Treasurer from such information as may be obtainable and, if necessary, the tax may be estimated on the basis of external indices, such as number of rooms, location, scale or rents, comparable rents, type of accommodations and service, number of employees and/or other factors. Notice of such determination shall be given to the person liable for the collection and/or payment of the tax. Such determination shall finally and irrevocably fix the tax unless the person against whom it is assessed within thirty days after giving of notice of such determination, shall apply to the City Treasurer for a hearing, or unless the City Treasurer of his own motion shall redetermine the same. After such hearing, the City Treasurer shall give notice of his determination to the person against whom the tax is assessed. The determination of the City shall be reviewable for error, illegality or unconstitutionality or any other reason whatsoever by a proceeding under article seventy-eight of the Civil Practice Law and Rules, provided however, that such

proceeding is instituted in the Supreme Court within thirty days after the giving of the notice of such determination. A proceeding under article seventy-eight of the Civil Practice Law and Rules shall not be instituted unless (a) the amount of any tax sought to be reviewed, with penalties and interest thereon, if any, shall be first deposited and there is filed an undertaking, issued by a surety company authorized to transact business in this state and approved by the superintendent of insurance of this state as to solvency and responsibility, in such amount as a justice of the supreme court shall approve to the effect that if such proceeding be dismissed or the tax confirmed the petitioner will pay all costs and charges which may accrue in the prosecution of such proceeding or (b) at the option of the petitioner such undertaking may be in a sum sufficient to cover the taxes, penalties and interest thereon stated in such determination plus the costs and charges which may accrue against it in the prosecution of the proceeding, in which event the petitioner shall not be required to pay such taxes, penalties and interest as a condition precedent to the application.

### SECTION 12 REFUNDS

- (1) In the manner provided in this section the City Treasurer shall refund or credit without interest, any tax, penalty or interest erroneously, illegally or unconstitutionally collected or paid if application to the City Treasurer for such refund shall be made within one year from the payment thereof. Whenever a refund is made by the City Treasurer, he shall state his reason therefore in writing. Such application may be made by the occupant, operator or other person who has actually paid the tax. Such application when made by an operator who has collected and paid over such tax to the City Treasurer, provided that the application is made within one year of the payment by the occupant to the operator, shall be acted upon and refunded any moneys due, only after such operator shall first establish to the satisfaction of the City Treasurer, under such regulations as the City Treasurer may prescribe, that he has repaid or will simultaneously repay to the occupant the amount for which the application for refund is made. The City Treasurer may, in lieu of any refund required to be made, allow credit therefore on payments due from the petitioner.
- Where any tax imposed hereunder shall have been erroneously, illegally or unconstitutionally collected and application for the refund thereof duly made to the City Treasurer, and such City Treasurer shall have made a determination denying such refund, such determination shall be reviewable by a proceeding under article seventy-eight of the Civil Practice Law and Rules, provided, however, that such proceeding is instituted within thirty days after the giving of the notice of such denial, that final determination of tax due was not previously made, and that an undertaking be filed with the City Treasurer in such amount and with such sureties as a Justice of the Supreme Court shall approve to the effect that if such proceeding be dismissed or the tax confirmed, the petitioner will pay all costs and charges which may accrue in the prosecution of such proceeding.
- (3) A person shall not be entitled to a revision, refund or credit under this section of a tax, interest or penalty which had been determined to be due pursuant to the provisions of section thirteen of this local law where he has had a hearing or an opportunity for a hearing, as provided in said section, or has failed to avail himself of the remedies therein provided. No refund or credit shall be made of a tax, interest or penalty paid after a determination by the City Treasurer made pursuant to section thirteen of this local law unless it be found that such determination was erroneous or unconstitutional

or otherwise improper by the City Treasurer after a hearing or of his own motion or in a proceeding under article seventy-eight of the Civil Practice Law and Rules, pursuant to the provisions of said section, in which event or refund or credit without interest shall be made of the tax, interest or penalty found to have been overpaid.

# SECTION 13 DISPOSITON OF REVENUES

All revenues from the imposition of the tax under this local law shall be paid into the treasury of the City of Lockport and shall be credited to and deposited in the General Fund Account of the City of Lockport. Four percent (4%) of said revenue shall be retained by the City of Lockport for administration and collection costs. The disposition of the remaining "net" revenues shall be as follows: Twenty-five percent (25%) of the net revenue from the tax shall be used for the promotion of community and economic development in the City of Lockport; Seventy-five percent (75%) of the net revenue shall be allocated and paid to a not-for-profit Corporation under contract with the County for the promotion of tourism in the County. The terms "economic development" and "tourism" may be defined by resolution of the Lockport City Council. Upon approval of the Governor, the additional 1% of such revenue of this tax shall be dedicated to the operation of the Discover Niagara Shuttle.

## SECTION 14 RESERVES

In cases where the occupancy or operator has applied for a refund and has instituted a proceeding under article seventy-eight of the Civil Practice Law and Rules to review a determination adverse to him on his application for refund, the City Treasurer shall set up appropriate reserves to meet any decision adverse to the City.

# SECTION 15 REMEDIES EXCLUSIVE

The remedies provided in this local law shall be exclusive remedies available to any person for the review of tax liability imposed by this local law; and no determination or proposed determination of tax or determination on any application for refund shall be enjoined or reviewed by an action for declaratory judgment, an action for money had and received or by any action or proceeding other than a proceeding in a nature of a certiorari proceeding under article seventy-eight of the Civil Practice Law and Rules; provided, however, that a taxpayer may proceed by declaratory judgment if he institutes suit within thirty days after a deficiency assessment is made and pays the amount of the deficiency assessment to the City Treasurer prior to the institution of such suit and posts a bond for costs as provided in this local law.

# SECTION 16 PROCEEDING TO RECOVER TAX

(1) Whenever any operator or any officer of a corporate operator or any occupancy or other person shall fail to collect and pay over any tax and/or to pay any tax, penalty or interest imposed by this local law as therein provided, the Corporation Counsel shall, upon the request of the City Treasurer bring or cause to be brought an action to enforce the payment of the same on behalf of the City of Lockport in any court of the State of New York or of any other state or of United States. If, however, the City Treasurer in his discretion believes that any such operator, officer, occupant or other person is about to

cease business, leave the state or remove or dissipate the assets out of which the tax or penalties might be satisfied, and that any such tax or penalty will not be paid when due, he may declare such tax or penalty to be immediately due and payable and may issue a warrant immediately.

(2) As an additional or alternate remedy, the City Treasurer may issue a warrant, directed to the sheriff commanding him to levy upon and sell the real and personal property of the operator or officer of a corporate operator or of the occupant or other person liable for the tax, which may be found within the City for the payment of the amount thereof, with any penalties and interest, and the cost of executing the warrant, and to return such warrant to the City Treasurer and to pay to him the money collected by virtue thereof within sixty days after the receipt of such warrant. The sheriff shall within five days after the receipt of the warrant file with the County Clerk a copy thereof, and thereupon such clerk shall enter in the judgment docket the name of the person mentioned in the warrant and the amount of the tax, penalties and interest for which the warrant is issued and the date when such copy is filed. Thereupon the amount of such warrant so docketed shall become a lien upon any interest in real and personal property of the person against whom the warrant is issued. The sheriff shall then proceed upon the warrant, in the same manner, and with like effect, as that provided by law in respect to executions issued against property upon judgments of a court of record and for services in executing the warrant he shall be entitled to the same fees, which he may collect in the same manner. In the discretion of the City Treasurer a warrant of like terms, force and effect may be issued and directed to any officer or employee of the City Treasurer and in the execution thereof such officer or employee shall have all the powers conferred by law upon sheriffs, but shall be entitled to no fee or compensation in excess of the actual expenses paid in the performance of such duty. If a warrant is

returned not satisfied in full, the City Treasurer may, from time to time, issue new warrants and shall also have the same remedies to enforce the amount due thereunder as if the City has recovered judgment therefore and execution thereon has been returned unsatisfied.

(3)Whenever an operator shall make a sale, transfer, or assignment in bulk of any part or the whole of his hotel or his lease, license or other agreement or right to possess or operate such hotel, apartment hotel, or of the equipment, furnishings, fixtures, supplies or stock of merchandise, of the said premises or lease, license or other agreement or right to possess or operate such hotel, apartment hotel and the equipment, furnishings, fixtures, supplies and stock of merchandise pertaining to the conduct or operation of such hotel, otherwise than in the ordinary and regular prosecution of business, the purchaser, transferee or assignee shall at least ten days before taking possession of the subject of said sale, transfer or assignment, or paying therefore, notify the City Treasurer by registered mail of the proposed sale and of the price, terms and conditions thereof whether or not the seller, transferor or assignor, has represented to or informed the purchaser, transferee or assignee that it owes any tax pursuant to this local law, and whether or not the purchaser, transferee or assignee has knowledge that such taxes are owing, and whether any such taxes are in fact owing. Whenever the purchaser, transferee or assignee shall fail to give notice to the City Treasurer as required by the preceding paragraph or whenever the City Treasurer shall inform the purchaser, transferee or assignee that a possible claim for such tax or taxes exists, any sums of money, property or choses in action, or other consideration, which the purchaser, transferee or assignee is required to transfer over to the seller, transferor or assignor

shall be subject to a first priority right and lien for any such taxes theretofore or thereafter determined to be due from the seller, transferor or assignor to the county, and the purchaser, transferee or assignee is forbidden to transfer to the seller, transferor or assignor any such sums of money, property or choses in action to the extent of the amount of the City's claim. For failure to comply with the provisions of this subdivision, the purchaser, transferee or assignee, in addition to being subject to the liabilities and remedies imposed under the provisions of the Uniform Commercial Code, shall be personally liable for the payment to the City of any such taxes theretofore or thereafter determined to be due to the City from the seller, transferor, or assignor, and such liability may be assessed and enforced in the same manner as the liability for tax under this local law.

## SECTION 17 GENERAL POWERS OF THE CITY TREASURER

In addition to the powers granted to the City Treasurer in this local law, he is hereby authorized and empowered:

- (1) To make, adopt and amend rules and regulations appropriate to the carrying out of this local law and the purposes thereof;
- (2) To extend for cause shown, the time of filing any return for a period not exceeding thirty days; and for cause shown, to waive penalties but not interest computed at the rate of six percentum per annum; and to compromise disputed claims in connection with the taxes hereby imposed;
- (3) To request information from the tax commission of the State of New York or the Treasury Department of the United States relative to any person, any other provision of this local law to the contrary notwithstanding;
- (4) To delegate his functions hereunder to a Deputy City Treasurer or any employee or employees of the office of City Treasurer;
- (5) To prescribe methods for determining rents for occupancy and to determine the taxable and non-taxable rents;
- (6) To require any operator within the City to keep detailed records of the nature and type of hotel maintained, nature and type of service rendered, the rooms available and rooms occupied daily, leases or occupancy contracts or arrangements, rents received, charged and accrued, the names and addresses of the occupants, whether or not any occupancy is claimed to be subject to the tax imposed by this local law, and to furnish such information upon request to the City Treasurer.
- (7) To assess, determine, revise and readjust the taxes imposed under this local law.

## SECTION 18 ADMINISTRATION OF OATHS AND COMPELLING TESTIMONY

(1) The City Treasurer or his employees or agents duly designated and authorized by him shall have power to administer oaths and take affidavits in relation to any matter or proceeding in the exercise of their powers and duties under this local law. The City Treasurer shall have power to subpoena and require the attendance of witnesses and

the production of books, papers and documents to secure information pertinent to the performance of his duties hereunder and of the enforcement of this local law and to examine them in relation thereto, and to issue commissions for the examination of witnesses who are out of the state or unable to attend before him or excused from attendance.

- (2) A justice of the Supreme Court either in court or at chambers shall have power summarily to enforce by proper proceedings the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the production and examination of books, papers and documents called from by the subpoena of the City Treasurer under this local law.
- (3) Any person who shall refuse to testify or to produce books or records or who shall testify falsely in any material matter pending before the City Treasurer under this local law shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishment for which shall be a fine of no more than one thousand dollars or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both such fine and imprisonment.
- (4) The officers who serve the summons or subpoena of the City Treasurer and witnesses attending in response thereto shall be entitled to the same fees as are allowed to officers and witnesses in civil cases in courts of record, except as herein otherwise provided. Such officers shall be the County Sheriff and his duly appointed deputies or any officers or employees of the City Treasurer, designated to serve such process.

# SECTION 19 PENALTIES AND INTEREST

- (1) Any person failing to file a return or to pay or pay over any tax to the City Treasurer within the time required by this local law shall be subject to a penalty of five percentum of the amount of tax due plus interest at the rate of one percentum of such tax for each month of delay excepting the first month after such return was required to be filed or such tax became due. Such penalties and interest shall be paid and disposed of in the same manner as other revenues from this local law. Unpaid penalties and interest may be enforced in the same manner as the tax imposed by this local law.
- (2) Any operator or occupant and any officer of a corporate operator or occupant failing to file a return required by this local law, or filing or causing to be filed, or making or causing to be made or giving or causing to be given any return, certificate, affidavit, representation, information testimony or statement required or authorized by this local law, which is willfully false, and any operator and any officer of a corporate operator willfully failing to file a bond required to be filed pursuant to this local law, or failing to file a registration certificate and such data in connection therewith as the City Treasurer may by regulation or otherwise require or to display or surrender the certificate of authority as required by this local law or assigning or transferring such certificate or authority and any operator and any officer of a corporate operator willfully failing to charge separately from the rent the tax herein imposed, or willfully failing to state such tax separately on any evidence of occupancy and on any bill or statement or receipt of rent issued or employed by the operator, or willfully failing or refusing to collect such tax from the occupant, and any operator failing to keep the records required by section nine of this local law, shall, in addition to the penalties herein or elsewhere prescribed, be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishment for which shall be a fine of not more than one thousand dollars, or imprisonment for not more than one year, or both such fine and

- imprisonment. Officers of a corporate operator shall be personally liable for the tax collected or required to be collected by such corporation under this local law, and subject to the penalties herein above imposed.
- (3) The certificate of the City Treasurer to the effect that a tax has not been paid, that a return, bond or registration certificate has not been filed, or that information has not been supplied pursuant to the provisions of this local law, shall be presumptive evidence thereof.

### SECTION 20 RETURNS TO BE SECRET

Except in accordance with proper judicial order, or as otherwise provided by law, it shall be unlawful for the City Treasurer or any officer or employee of the office of City Treasurer to divulge or make known in any manner the rents or other information relating to the business of a taxpayer contained in any return required under this local law. The officer charged with the custody of such returns shall not be required to produce any of them or evidence of anything contained in them in any action of proceeding in any court, except on behalf of the City Treasurer in an action or proceeding under the provisions of this local law, or on behalf of any party to any action or proceeding under the provisions of this local law when the returns or facts shown thereby are directly involved in such action or proceeding, in either of which

events the court may require the production of, and may admit in evidence, so much of said returns or of the facts shown thereby, as are pertinent to the action or proceeding and no more. Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit the delivery to a taxpayer or his duly authorized representative of a certified copy of any return filed in connection with his tax nor to prohibit the publication of statistics so classified as to prevent the identification of particular returns and the items thereof, or the inspection by the Corporation Counsel or other legal representatives of the City or by the District Attorney of Niagara County, of the return of any taxpayer who shall bring action to set aside or review the tax based thereon, or against whom an action or proceeding has been instituted for the collection of a tax or penalty. Returns shall be preserved for three years and thereafter until the City Treasurer permits them to be destroyed.

## SECTION 21 NOTICES AND LIMITATIONS OF TIME

- Any notice authorized or required under the provisions of this local law may be given by mailing the same to the person for whom it is intended in a post paid envelope addressed to such person at the address given in the last return filed by him pursuant to the provisions of this local law, or in any application made by him or, if no return has been filed or application made, then to such address as may be obtainable. The mailing of such notice shall be presumptive evidence of the receipt of the same by the person to whom addressed. Any period of time which is determined according to the provisions of this local law by the giving of notice shall commence to run from the date of filing of such notice.
- (2) The provisions of the Civil Practice Law and Rules or any other law relative to limitations of time for the enforcement of a civil remedy shall not apply to any proceeding or action taken by the City to levy, appraise, assess, determine or enforce the collection of any tax or penalty provided by this local law. However, except in the case of a willfully false

or fraudulent return with intent to evade the tax, no assessment of additional tax shall be made after the expiration of more than three years from the date of the filing of a return; provided, however, that where no return has been filed as provided by law the tax may be assessed at any time.

(3) Where, before the expiration of the period prescribed herein for the assessment of an additional tax, a taxpayer has consented in writing that such period be extended, the amount of such additional tax due may be determined at any time within such extended period. The period so extended may be further extended by subsequent consents in writing made before the expiration of the extended period.

## SECTION 22 CONSTRUCTION AND ENFORCEMENT

This enactment shall be construed and enforced in conformity with articles twenty-eight and twenty-nine of the tax law of the State of New York pursuant to which the same is enacted.

## SECTION 23 SEPARABILITY

If any provision of this enactment or the application thereof shall for any reason be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this enactment but shall be confined in its operation to the provisions thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and the application of such provision to other persons or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

## SECTION 24 EFFECTIVE DATE

This enactment shall take effect on the first day of December, two thousand nineteen, and continue for a period of three years from the date of said enactment, except that certificates of registration may be filed and certificates of authority to collect tax may be issued prior to said date.

Whereas, the Common Council of the City is conducting a review of the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning for the RA Zone; and

Whereas, such pursuant to Section 28-a of the General City Law the Common Council may designate the Planning Board or a special board to prepare a plan amendment.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Common Council of City of Lockport as follows:

- 1. The Common Council declares the proposed amendment of the RA Zone Comprehensive Plan a Type I action under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA).
- 2. Because the change in the Comprehensive Plan could result in the loss of open space, loss of recreational resource, increase in traffic, increase in density, drainage and infrastructure changes, significant increase in demand for public services, and potentially significant cumulative impacts (along with changes proposed in the neighboring Town of Lockport), the Board finds the Plan Amendment may result in a significant negative impact on the environment and therefore issues a Positive Declaration under SEQRA..
- 3. The Planning Board, assisted by City Staff appointed by the Mayor, shall consider and prepare the Comprehensive Plan Amendment.
- 4. This Resolution shall be effective immediately.
