RULES AND ORDERS OF THE COMMON COUNCIL

1. Roll Call - At the hour appointed for the meeting of the Council, the Mayor shall take the chair and direct a call of the members of the Council, and the Clerk shall note the absentees. Upon the appearance of a quorum, the Mayor shall call the members to order. If a quorum be not present, they shall send for absent members. Following shall be the

ORDER OF BUSINESS

- a. Reading of minutes. Reading and approval of the minutes preceding meeting; but a majority of the members present may approve of, or dispense with, the reading of the minutes of any previous meeting.
- b. Communications from the Mayor.
- c. Communications and reports of officers of the corporation.
- d. Petitions and remonstrances.
- e. Reports of Standing Committees, in the order named in rule.
- f. Reports of Special Committees.
- g. Committee of the Whole.
- h. Executive business.
- i. Motions, resolutions and notices.
- j. Unfinished business.

DUTIES OF THE MAYOR AS PRESIDING OFFICER

2. The Mayor, as presiding officer, shall possess the powers and perform the duties as herein prescribed:

- a. They shall preserve order and decorum.
- b. Question of Order. They shall decide all questions of order, subject to appeal of the Council. On every appeal they shall have the right in his/her place to assign his/her reason for his/her decision; but any member may state the grounds for his/her appeal.
- c. Appointment of Committees. He/she shall appoint all committees except where the council shall otherwise order.
- d. Temporary Chairman. He/she may substitute any member to perform the duties of the chair, but such substitution shall not extend beyond the adjournment of the Council, except by special consent of the Council.
- e. Committee of the Whole. When the Council shall be ready to go into Committee of the Whole, he/she shall name a chairman to preside therein.
- f. Privileges of the floor. He/she shall have the right to invite to the floor of the Council such persons as he/she shall deem deserving of the privilege; but the right of admission under such invitation shall not extend beyond the day on which it shall be given.
- 3. While a question is being put While the presiding officer is putting a question, no member shall walk across or out of the room; nor in such case, or when a member is speaking, shall entertain any private discourse, nor, while a member is speaking, shall pass between him and the chair.
- 4. **Speaking** Every member, when he/she speaks, shall, from his/her chair, address the presiding officer as Mr. /Madam Mayor, or proper title and shall not proceed until recognized by the presiding officer; and no member shall speak more than twice to the same question, nor more than five minutes each time at the same meeting, without requesting and receiving the consent of a majority of the members present, by a roll call vote.
- 5. **Speaker recognized** When two or more members request recognition simultaneously, the presiding officer shall name the member he wishes to speak first.
- 6. <u>Call to order</u> Any member may be called to order; in which case the member so called to order shall immediately sit down. The point of order shall be stated at the request of the presiding officer, by the member raising the question of order, and shall be decided without debate, before proceeding to other business.

- 7. <u>Vote</u> Every member shall vote when a question is stated from the chair, unless excused by the Council; and every member voting shall be in his/her place.
- 8. <u>Petitions, etc.</u> Petitions and other papers may be presented by the presiding officer or any member, but when presented by a member, he/she shall first endorse on the petition or paper the substance thereof.
- 9. Motions or Resolutions No motion or resolution shall be debated or put until seconded. No member shall make or second a motion or resolution except he/she request recognition from his/her chair for that purpose; and when seconded the motion or resolution shall be stated distinctly by the presiding officer, before being put or debated. No motion or resolution shall be presented for action, unless it has been reviewed by Corporation Council and submitted in writing to the Clerk by noon of the day of the Committee of the Whole work session, one week prior to the Common Council meeting, excluding the work session the day of the Common Council Meeting, or unless by prior authorizations of the Mayor, City Clerk, and City Attorney and then by consent of two-thirds of the whole number of the Council. Resolutions submitted for consideration may go to the appropriate committee prior to submission. A motion or resolution referred to any committee may be recalled from that committee at any subsequent Council meeting by vote of a majority of the whole number of the Council. If any motion or resolution referred to a committee shall not have been reported out within forty-five days of the time when it was referred, then the sponsor of the motion or resolution may have it brought out for Council consideration without any committee report. Any motion or resolution may be withdrawn at any time before decision, commitment or amendment by unanimous consent.
- 10. Ayes and noes If any member require it, the ayes and noes upon any question shall be taken and entered upon the minutes of the Council. In taking the same, the names of members shall be taken alphabetically.
- 11. <u>Appointment of committees</u> All committees shall be appointed by the presiding officer, unless otherwise specially directed by the Council, in which case they shall be appointed by ballot.

PRIVILEGED QUESTIONS

- 12. <u>Order of motions</u> When a question is pending, no motion shall be received, except as hereinafter specified; which motion shall have preference in the order stated:
 - a. For an adjournment of the Council.
 - b. A call of the Council.
 - c. To lay on the table.
 - d. For the previous question.
 - e. To postpone indefinitely.
 - f. To postpone to a day certain.
 - g. To refer to the Committee of the Whole.
 - h. To refer to a standing committee.
 - i. To refer to a special or select committee.
 - j. To amend.
- 13. Non-debatable motions A motion to adjourn, lay on the table, or for the previous question, shall be decided without amendment or debate; and all questions of order, and all questions relating to the order of business, shall be decided without debate. The several motions to postpone or to refer, shall preclude all debate of the main question.

- 14. <u>Reconsideration</u> A motion for reconsideration if lost, shall not again be repeated at the same meeting of the Council, nor shall any question be reconsidered more than once.
- 15. Executive business Executive business shall be governed by Chapter 511 of the Laws of 1976.
- 16. <u>Concerning applicant for office</u> All information, or any remarks by any member concerning the character or qualifications of any person whose name shall be before the council for an appointment to any office, shall be kept secret, and all proceedings and things of the Council, or any member thereof, in secret session, shall be kept secret until the Council shall remove all injunctions to secrecy.
- 17. <u>Divisions of questions</u> If any question contains several distinct propositions, it may be divided by the chair.
- 18. <u>Reading of paper</u> Any member may have any paper in possession of the council read, upon request, unless the same shall be objected to by some other member; and then the question shall be determined by a vote of a majority of the whole council, without debate.
- 19. <u>Speaking to question</u> After the roll-call upon any question has commenced, no member shall speak to the question except to explain his/her vote, and then not to exceed five minutes; nor shall any motion be made until after the result is declared.
- 20. <u>Committee's Report</u> No report shall be received from any committee unless the committee, or a quorum thereof, shall have met and considered the matter in a regular or special meeting of the committee.
- 21. <u>Robert's Rule of Order</u> Whenever any question not covered by these rules shall arise, this council shall be governed by the parliamentary rules as laid down in Robert's Rule of Order. The Corporation Counsel shall preside as the Parliamentarian at all meetings. (Amended 4/2/14)
- 22. <u>Standing Committees</u> The following standing committees shall be appointed by the Mayor at the commencement of the session, or as soon thereafter as may be practicable:

FINANCE COMMITTEE – to consist of Common Council members as appointed by the Mayor, and exofficio members: City Treasurer and Director of Finance.

PUBLIC HEALTH & SAFETY – to consist of Common Council members as appointed by the Mayor and exofficio members: Police Chief, Fire Chief, and Chief Building Inspector.

HIGHWAYS & PARKS - to consist of Common Council members as appointed by the Mayor and ex-officio members: Assistant City Engineer, Director of Streets and Parks, Public Works Supervisor

WATER & SEWER - to consist of Common Council members as appointed by the Mayor and ex-officio members: Assistant City Engineer, Sr. Building Inspector, Chief Operator/WWTP, Chief Water Treatment Plant Operator, Water Distribution Maintenance Supervisor

YOUTH – to consist of Common Council members as appointed by the Mayor and ex-officio members: Assistant City Engineer.

PERSONNEL – to consist of Common Council members as appointed by the Mayor and ex-officio member: City Clerk and Personnel Officer.

WASHINGTON HUNT - to consist of three members: Mayor and two aldermen as appointed by the Mayor.

The Common Council President shall be qualified to sit as a member of any standing committee whenever his/her presence will enable such committee to reach a quorum for the transaction of business.

23. <u>Changing of Rules</u> - No standing rule or order of the council shall be amended, repealed, rescinded, changed or superseded, except by a vote of two-thirds of the whole council, nor shall any new rule be added thereto, except by a like vote; but they may be suspended at any time by a two-thirds consent of the whole council.

24. Regular Meetings:

- a. The regular meeting of the Council shall be held on the first and third Wednesday of each month, except when otherwise directed by resolution of the Common Council. The hour of meeting shall be 5:30 P.M., and if a quorum shall not be present at 6:00 P.M. the Common Council shall stand adjourned. The Committee of the Whole shall meet one half hour prior to the start of the regularly scheduled Common Council meetings.
- b. The Committee of the Whole work sessions if scheduled shall be held at 5:00 P.M. every Wednesday of each month or any other day and time if so directed by the President of the Common Council.
- 25. <u>Business of Special Meeting</u> It shall not be in order at any special meeting to proceed to any other business than that for which the meeting was convened, unless by unanimous consent of all members present.

- 28. General rules and regulations for the letting of contracts for materials, supplies, equipment or public works projects (including local public improvements).
 - I. After any materials, supplies, equipment or public works project shall have been ordered, the Common Council shall, at the time of adopting the ordinance therefor, or at any time thereafter, give notice, or order and direct the same to be given, that proposals for the doing and completion of said work will be received.
 - 2. All notices shall be given by the City Clerk by publishing same in the official paper of this city.
 - 3. Notices for the receiving of proposals shall be of the following form the blanks therein to be filled at the time of publication as necessities require: NOTICE TO BIDDERS City Clerk's Office, Lockport, New York Sealed proposals shall be received by the undersigned at his office, Lockport Municipal Building, One Locks Plaza, Lockport, NY until (day), (date), at (time) for in accordance with the specifications made therefor and obtainable at the (appropriate City office). Proposals must be for the amount in gross and include everything connected with the proposed materials, supplies, equipment or public works project being bid. Each proposal must be accompanied by a certified check or bid bond in an amount equal to ten percent of the bid. The Common Council hereby reserves the right to reject any or all proposals. By order of the Common Council of the City of Lockport, N.Y. ________ City Clerk

- 4. No proposal after time expires. After the time in said notice specified for the reception of proposals shall have expired no further proposals for the work specified therein shall be received; and each and every plan and specification therein published shall be particularly and strictly observed by all concerned.
- 5. Proposals to be guarded. The City Clerk shall receive all proposals at his office in this City, and shall carefully guard and preserve the same unopened; he shall not permit either or any of them to be taken from his custody until such time and in such manner as the Common Council may order and direct.

A LOCAL LAW to amend Chapter 66 of the Lockport City Code Building Construction Administration

BE IT ENACTED by the Common Council of the City of Lockport, New York as follows: Section 66-15(C) of the Lockport City Code is hereby amended by deleting the same in its entirety and substituting therefore a new Section 66-15(C) to read as follows: § 66-15(C). Penalties for Offenses. In addition to those penalties prescribed by State law, any person who violates any provision of the Uniform Code, the Energy Code or this chapter, or any term or condition of any building permit, certificate of occupancy/certificate of completion, temporary certificate, stop-work order, operating permit or other notice or order issued by the Code Enforcement Officer pursuant to any provision of this chapter shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$250.00 or imprisonment for a period not exceeding 15 days or both. City of Lockport Local Law No. 2 of the year 2020

A LOCAL LAW TO ESTABLISH A SUSTAINABLE ENERGY LOAN PROGRAM (OPEN C-PACE) IN THE CITY OF LOCKPORT

Be it enacted by the City of Lockport (the "Municipality") as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 38 of the Lockport City Code is hereby amended by deleting the same in its entirety and replacing it with this local law known as the "Energize NY Open C-PACE Financing Program" that shall read as follows:

ARTICLE I

- **§1.** Legislative findings, intent and purpose, authority.
- A. It is the policy of both the Municipality and the State of New York (the "State") to achieve energy efficiency and renewable energy improvements, reduce greenhouse

gas emissions, mitigate the effect of global climate change, and advance a clean energy economy. The Municipality finds that it can fulfill this policy by providing property assessed clean energy financing to Qualified Property Owners (as defined below) for the installation of renewable energy systems and energy efficiency measures. This local law establishes a program that will allow the Energy Improvement Corporation (as defined below, "EIC"), a local development corporation, acting on behalf of the Municipality pursuant to the municipal agreement (the "Municipal Agreement") to be entered into between the Municipality and EIC, to make funds available to Qualified Property Owners that will be repaid through charges on the real properties benefited by such funds, thereby fulfilling the purposes of this local law and accomplishing an important public purpose. This local law provides a method of implementing the public policies expressed by, and exercising the authority provided by, Article 5-L of the General Municipal Law (as defined below, the "Enabling Act").

- B. The Municipality is authorized to execute, deliver and perform the Municipal Agreement and otherwise to implement this Energize NY Open C-PACE Financing Program pursuant to the Constitution and laws of New York, including particularly Article IX of the Constitution, Section 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law, the Enabling Act and this local law.
- C. This local law, which is adopted pursuant to Section 10 of the Municipal Home Rule Law and the Enabling Act shall be known and may be cited as the "Energize NY Open C-PACE Local Law".

§2. Definitions

- A. Capitalized terms used but not defined herein have the meanings assigned in the Enabling Act.
- B. For purposes of this local law, and unless otherwise expressly stated or unless the context requires, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

Annual Installment Amount – shall have the meaning assigned in Section 8, paragraph B.

Annual Installment Lien – shall have the meaning assigned in Section 8 paragraph B. **Authority** – the New York State Energy Research and Development Authority. **Benefit Assessment Lien** – shall have the meaning assigned in Section 3, paragraph A.

Benefited Property – Qualified Property for which the Qualified Property Owner has entered into a Finance Agreement for a Qualified Project.

Benefited Property Owner – the owner of record of a Benefited Property.

EIC – the Energy Improvement Corporation, a local development corporation, duly organized under section 1411 of the Not-For-Profit Corporation Law of the State, authorized hereby on behalf of the Municipality to implement the Program by providing funds to Qualified Property Owners and providing for repayment of such funds from money collected by or on behalf of the Municipality as a charge to be levied on the real property.

Eligible Costs – costs incurred by the Benefited Property Owner in connection with a Qualified Project and the related Finance Agreement, including application fees, EIC's Program administration fee, closing costs and fees, title and appraisal fees, professionals' fees, permits, fees for design and drawings and any other related fees, expenses and costs, in each case as approved by EIC and the Financing Party under the Finance Agreement

Enabling Act – Article 5-L of the General Municipal Law of the State, or a successor law, as in effect from time to time.

Finance Agreement – the finance agreement described in Section 6A of this local law.

Financing Charges – all charges, fees and expenses related to the loan under the Finance Agreement including accrued interest, capitalized interest, prepayment premiums, and penalties as a result of a default or late payment and costs and reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by the Financing Party as a result of a foreclosure or other legal proceeding brought against the Benefited Property to enforce any delinquent Annual Installment Liens.

Financing Parties – Third party capital providers approved by EIC to provide financing to Qualified Property Owners or other financial support to the Program which have entered into separate agreements with EIC to administer the Program in the Municipality.

Municipality – the City of Lockport, a municipality of the State constituting a tax district as defined in Section 1102 of the RPTL of the State.

Municipal Lien – a lien on Qualified Property which secures the obligation to pay real property taxes, municipal charges, or governmentally imposed assessments in respect of services or benefits to a Qualified Property.

Non-Municipal Lien – a lien on Qualified Property which secures any obligation other than the obligation to pay real property taxes, municipal charges, or governmentally-imposed assessments in respect of services or benefits to a Qualified Property Owner or Qualified Property.

Program – the Energize NY Open C-PACE Financing Program authorized hereby.

Qualified Project – the acquisition, construction, reconstruction or equipping of Energy Efficiency Improvements or Renewable Energy Systems or other projects authorized under the Enabling Act on a Qualified Property, together with a related Energy Audit, Renewable Energy System Feasibility Study and/or other requirements under or pursuant to the Enabling Act, with funds provided in whole or in part by Financing Parties under the Program to achieve the purposes of the Enabling Act.

Qualified Property – Any real property other than a residential building containing less than three dwelling units, which is within the boundaries of the Municipality that has been determined to be eligible to participate in the Program under the procedures for eligibility set forth under this local law and the Enabling Act and has become the site of a Qualified Project.

Qualified Property Owner – the owner of record of Qualified Property which has been determined by EIC to meet the requirements for participation in the Program as an owner, and any transferee owner of such Qualified Property.

RPTL – the Real Property Tax Law of the State, as amended from time to time.

Secured Amount – as of any date, the aggregate amount of principal loaned to the Qualified Property Owner for a Qualified Project, together with Eligible Costs and Financing Charges, as provided herein or in the Finance Agreement, as reduced pursuant to Section 8, paragraph C.

State – the State of New York.

§3. Establishment of an Energize NY Open C-PACE Financing Program

- A. An Energize NY Open C-PACE Financing Program is hereby established by the Municipality, whereby EIC acting on its behalf pursuant to the Municipal Agreement, may arrange for the provision of funds by Financing Parties to Qualified Property Owners in accordance with the Enabling Act and the procedures set forth under this local law, to finance the acquisition, construction, reconstruction, and installation of Qualified Projects and Eligible Costs and Financing Charges approved by EIC and by the Financing Party under the Finance Agreement. EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, and with the consent of the Benefited Property Owner, will record a Benefit Assessment Lien on the Benefited Property in the Secured Amount (the "Benefit Assessment Lien") on the land records for the Municipality. Such recording shall be exempt from any charge, mortgage recording tax or other fee in the same manner as if recorded by the Municipality.
- B. Before a Qualified Property Owner and a Financing Party enter into a Finance Agreement which results in a loan to finance a Qualified Project, repayment of which is secured by a Benefit Assessment Lien, a written consent from each existing mortgage holder of the Qualified Property shall be obtained, permitting the Benefit Assessment Lien and each Annual Installment Lien to take priority over all existing mortgages.

§4. Procedures for eligibility

- A. Any property owner in the Municipality may submit an application to EIC on such forms as have been prepared by EIC and made available to property owners on the website of EIC and at the Municipality's offices.
- B. Every application submitted by a property owner shall be reviewed by EIC, acting on behalf of the Municipality, which shall make a positive or negative determination on such application based upon the criteria enumerated in the Enabling Act and § 5 of this local law. EIC may also request further information from the property owner where necessary to aid in its determination.
- C. If a positive determination on an application is made by EIC, acting on behalf of the Municipality, the property owner shall be deemed a Qualified Property Owner and shall be eligible to participate in the Program in accordance with § 6 of this local law.

§5. Application criteria

Upon the submission of an application, EIC, acting on behalf of the Municipality, shall make a positive or negative determination on such application based upon the following criteria for the making of a financing:

- A. The property owner may not be in bankruptcy and the property may not constitute property subject to any pending bankruptcy proceeding;
- B. The amount financed under the Program shall be repaid over a term not to exceed the weighted average of the useful life of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements to be installed on the property as determined by EIC;
- C. Sufficient funds are available from Financing Parties to provide financing to the property owner;
- D. The property owner is current in payments on any existing mortgage on the Qualified Property;
- E. The property owner is current in payments on any real property taxes on the Qualified Property; and
- F. Such additional criteria, not inconsistent with the criteria set forth above, as the State, the Municipality, or EIC acting on its behalf, or other Financing Parties may set from time to time.

§6. Energize NY Finance Agreement

- A. A Qualified Property Owner may participate in the Program through the execution of a finance agreement made by and between the Qualified Property Owner and a Financing Party, to which EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, shall be a third-party beneficiary (the "Finance Agreement"). Upon execution and delivery of the Finance Agreement, the property that is the subject of the Finance Agreement shall be deemed a "Benefited Property").
- B. Upon execution and delivery of the Finance Agreement, the Benefited Property Owner shall be eligible to receive funds from the Financing Party for the acquisition, construction, and installation of a Qualified Project, together with Eligible Costs and Financing Charges approved by EIC and by the Financing Party, provided the requirements of the Enabling Act, the Municipal Agreement and this local law have been met.
- C. The Finance Agreement shall include the terms and conditions of repayment of the Secured Amount and the Annual Installment Amounts.
- D. EIC may charge fees to offset the costs of administering the Program and such fees, if not paid by the Financing Party, shall be added to the Secured Amount.

§7. Terms and conditions of repayment

The Finance Agreement shall set forth the terms and conditions of repayment in accordance with the following:

- A. The principal amount of the funds loaned to the Benefited Property Owner for the Qualified Project, together with Eligible Costs and Financing Charges approved by EIC and by the Financing Party, shall be specially assessed against the Benefited Property and will be evidenced by a Benefit Assessment Lien recorded against the Benefited Property on the land records on which liens are recorded for properties within the Municipality. The special benefit assessment shall constitute a "charge" within the meaning of the Enabling Act and shall be collected in annual installments in the amounts certified by the Financing Party in a schedule provided at closing and made part of the Benefit Assessment Lien. Said amount shall be annually levied, billed and collected by EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, and shall be paid to the Financing Party as provided in the Finance Agreement.
- B. The term of such repayment shall be determined at the time the Finance Agreement is executed by the Benefited Property Owner and the Financing Party, not to exceed the weighted average of the useful life of the systems and improvements as determined by EIC, acting on behalf of the Municipality.
- C. The rate of interest for the Secured Amount shall be fixed by the Financing Party in conjunction with EIC, acting on behalf of the Municipality, as provided in the Finance Agreement.

§8. Levy of Annual Installment Amount and Creation of Annual Installment Lien

- A. Upon the making of the loan pursuant to the Finance Agreement, the Secured Amount shall become a special Benefit Assessment Lien on the Benefited Property in favor of the Municipality. The amount of the Benefit Assessment Lien shall be the Secured Amount. Evidence of the Benefit Assessment Lien shall be recorded by EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, in the land records for properties in the Municipality. Such recording shall be exempt from any charge, mortgage recording tax or other fee in the same manner as if recorded by the Municipality. The Benefit Assessment Lien shall not be foreclosed upon by or otherwise enforced by the Municipality.
- B. The Finance Agreement shall provide for the repayment of the Secured Amount in installments made at least annually, as provided in a schedule attached to the Benefit Assessment Lien (the "Annual Installment Amount"). The Annual Installment Amount shall be levied by EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, on the Benefited Property in the same manner as levies for municipal charges, shall become a lien on the Benefited Property as of the first day of January of the fiscal year for which levied (the "Annual Installment Lien") and shall remain a lien until paid. The creation or any recording of the Annual Installment Lien shall be exempt from any charge, mortgage recording tax or other fee in the same manner as if recorded by the Municipality. Payment to the Financing Party shall be considered payment for this purpose. Such payment shall partly or wholly discharge the Annual Installment Lien. Delinquent Annual Installment Amounts may accrue Financing Charges as may be provided in the Finance Agreement. Any additional Financing Charges imposed by the Financing Party pursuant to the Finance Agreement shall increase

the Annual Installment Amount and the Annual Installment Lien for the year in which such overdue payments were first due.

- C. The Benefit Assessment Lien shall be reduced annually by the amount of each Annual Installment Lien when each Annual Installment Lien becomes a lien. Each Annual Installment Lien shall be subordinate to all Municipal Liens, whether created by Section 902 of the RPTL or by any other State or local law. No portion of a Secured Amount shall be recovered by the Municipality, EIC, or an assignee upon foreclosure, sale or other disposition of the Benefited Property unless and until all Municipal Liens are fully discharged. Each Annual Installment Lien, however, shall have priority over all Non-Municipal Liens, irrespective of when created, except as otherwise required by law.
- D. Neither the Benefit Assessment Lien nor any Annual Installment Lien shall be extinguished or accelerated in the event of a default or bankruptcy of the Benefited Property Owner. Each Annual Installment Amount shall be considered a charge upon the Benefited Property and shall be collected by EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, at the same time and in the same manner as real property taxes or municipal charges. Each Annual Installment Lien shall remain a lien until paid. Amounts collected in respect of an Annual Installment Lien shall be remitted to EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, or the Financing Party, as may be provided in the Finance Agreement.
- E. EIC shall act as the Municipality's agent in collection of the Annual Installment Amounts. If any Benefited Property Owner fails to pay an Annual Installment Amount, the Financing Party may redeem the Benefited Property by paying the amount of all unpaid Municipal Liens thereon, and thereafter shall have the right to collect any amounts in respect of an Annual Installment Lien by foreclosure or any other remedy available at law. Any foreclosure shall not affect any subsequent Annual Installment Liens.
- F. EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, may sell or assign for consideration any and all Benefit Assessment Liens and Annual Installment Liens to Financing Parties that provide financing to Qualified Properties pursuant to Finance Agreements. The Financing Parties may sell or assign for consideration any and all Benefit Assessment Liens and Annual Installment Liens received from EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, subject to certain conditions provided in the administration agreement between EIC and the Financing Party. The assignee or assignees of such Benefit Assessment Liens and Annual Installment Liens shall have and possess the same powers and rights at law or in equity as the Municipality would have had if the Benefit Assessment Lien and the Annual Installment Liens had not been assigned with regard to the precedence and priority of such lien, the accrual of interest and the fees and expenses of collection.

§9. Verification and report

EIC, on behalf of the Municipality, shall verify and report on the installation and performance of Renewable Energy Systems and Energy Efficiency Improvements financed by the Program in such form and manner as the Authority may establish.

§10. Separability If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part of this local law shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, section, or part thereof involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered.

Section 2. This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

City of Lockport Local Law No. 3 of the year 2020

A Local Law "Imposing a Ninety (90) Day Moratorium on Ground Mounted Solar Panel and Solar Farm Installations within the City"

Be it enacted by the Common Council of the City of Lockport as follows:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE AND INTENT

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend the Code to place a ninety (90) day moratorium on the processing, permitting and/or construction of ground mounted solar panels and solar farms within the City to allow time for the drafting and adoption of amendments to the Code of the City of Lockport affecting these types of uses. These amendments, among other things, will amend the location where ground mounted solar panels and solar farms may be allowed set design requirements and such other regulations as may be necessary to promote and preserve the health, safety and welfare of the City of Lockport and its citizens.

SECTION 2. FINDINGS.

The City of Lockport Common Council does hereby find that without a temporary halt on the processing, permitting, and approvals for ground mounted solar panels and solar farms there is the potential that such uses could be located in unsuitable areas within the City and/or on

particular lots without adequate dimensional regulations for, such uses would have materially adverse and irreversible impacts on the City.

The Common Council also finds that it is in need of time to perform the necessary analysis of the potential types of ground mounted solar panels and solar farms that could be located in the City. By maintaining the status quo regarding such uses the Common Council can provide for the planned orderly growth and development of the City.

SECTION 3. MORATORIUM IMPOSED; APPLICABILITY.

For the period commencing on the effective date of this Local Law, and for ninety (90) days thereafter, there shall be a moratorium on the processing, permitting, and/or construction of ground mounted solar panels and solar farms within the City of Lockport. This moratorium shall not effect an existing or proposed rooftop-mounted solar energy system that is designed and intended to generate electricity solely for use on said lot.

SECTION 4. TERM.

This moratorium shall be in effect for a period of ninety (90) consecutive days from its effective date.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY

The invalidity of any word, section, clause, paragraph, sentence or part or provision of this Local Law shall not affect the validity or any other part of this Local Law which shall be in effect.

This law shall be effective upon filing with the Office of the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport received an application from Ruhlmann Farm Acres LLC and OYA Ruhlmann A LLC for a Special Use Permit for a solar energy system to be located at 251 Summit Street, Lockport, New York; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport Planning Board reviewed the proposed project and recommended approval to the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Lockport; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport Common Council, on Wednesday, October 7, 2020, did hold a duly advertised Public Hearing at Municipal Building, One Locks Plaza, Lockport, New York 14094 regarding the application for a Special Use Permit for a solar energy system located at **251 Summit Street**, Lockport, New York 14094 and at such public hearing every party wishing to be heard was heard; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council has considered all relevant testimony, documents, and all other information presented and placed before it;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that based on the testimony, documents, and other information presented, the Common Council makes the following findings:

- a. That the use, solar energy system, is designed, located and proposed to be operated so the public health, safety, welfare and convenience will be protected; *to wit*: the project has been designed and located such that the solar panels will be behind structures and vegetation substantially reducing its visibility and impact to neighboring properties and public highways, the project is also located in a sparsely populated area of the City, and
- b. That the use, solar energy system, will not cause substantial injury to the value of other property in the neighborhood where it is located, *to wit*: the project has been designed and located, such that the solar panels will be behind structures and vegetation thus substantially reducing its visibility and impact to neighboring properties, berms and landscaping have also been made part of the project to reduce visibility to neighbors, and the applicant has exceeded the setbacks required under the City Code for distances from neighboring properties, structures and lot lines; and
- c. That the use, solar energy system, will be compatible with adjoining development and the character of the neighborhood where it is located, *to wit*: the neighborhood the project is located in is zoned residential. However, it generally consists of large lots with a few single-family homes and/or large farming operations and woods. The parcels are also within close proximity to the Transit Road commercial corridor. The character of the neighborhood where the project is located will not be affected since the project has been designed to substantially minimize and obscure the solar panels from view of neighboring properties and public highways; and
- d. That the use, solar energy system, provide adequate screening to preserve the character of the neighborhood, *to wit*: the project does require a berm and additional landscape plantings; and
- e. That the use, solar energy system, provide adequate off-street and loading and the special use will not substantially interfere with traffic on abutting streets, *to wit*: while the project will cause an increase in traffic on Summit Street and Ruhlmann Road during construction that impact is not expected to be substantial and will be limited in time to only the period of construction. The nature of the project does not require the presence of employees or other staff beyond periods of required maintenance, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Use Permit for operation of solar energy systems at **251 Summit Street** is approved with the following conditions:

- A. Landscape buffering consistent with the landscape plan submitted by or on behalf of **OYA Ruhlmann A LLC** with the continuous live vegetation, evergreen trees planted in a staggered format, forever green, dense, and sufficiently high to block view of the fence and solar energy systems at ground level from the street and neighboring properties; and
- B. Solar farms are to be constructed and operated in accordance with the Guidelines for Agricultural Mitigation for Solar Energy Projects (rev. dated 4/19/2018).
 - C. Decommissioning Plan.
- 1. At the completion of construction of the Project (the "Start Date"), **OYA Ruhlmann A LLC**, its successors and assigns (hereinafter the "Owner") shall post a Decommissioning Bond (the "Bond") for the benefit of the City in the amount set forth in Table 4 of the Decommissioning Plan submitted to the Planning Board and City of Lockport. At the end of each one-year period following the Start Date (the "Anniversary Date"), Owner shall renew the Bond according to the Decommissioning Bond Value Schedule in Table 4 of the Decommissioning Plan. Upon posting of the Bond, the Owner will provide a copy of the related Bond policy with contact information for the financial provider. Owner or its successor in title to this Project shall be responsible for renewing such Bond as long as the system remains in commercial operation, which is expected to be for a period of thirty-five (35) years.

The Parties agree that the Bond shall be used solely to pay for any Decommissioning costs of the Project. Owner shall have no further payment obligations in connection with Decommissioning during the operation of the Project provided that Owner complies with posting the Bond in accordance with this Agreement. Nonetheless, in the event the actual Decommissioning costs exceed the amount covered by the Bond, Owner or its successor in title to this Project shall be responsible for any such excess costs, provided such excess costs are not as a result of the City using any amount covered by the Bond for any reason other than to pay for Decommissioning costs of the Project. In the event the City uses any amount from the Bond for any reason other than to pay for Decommissioning costs related to the Project, the City shall be responsible to pay for such amount used and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner and Landowner of the Project from any claim, loss, damage, liability or costs (including any reasonable attorney costs) arising from the City's use of the funds.

- 2. Decommissioning as used in this Agreement shall mean the removal and disposal of all structures, equipment and accessories, including subsurface foundations and all other material, concrete, or debris, that were installed in connection with the Project and the reasonable restoration of the parcel of land on which the Project is built to either of the following, at the Landowner's option ("Decommissioning"): (i) the condition such lands were in prior to the development, construction and operation of the Project, including restoration, regrading, and reseeding, or (ii) the condition designed by a subsequent Owner or developer as agreed upon with the Landowner and the City. Costs of Decommissioning under this agreement include labor, professional services and any other costs reasonably associated with such restoration.
- 3. The Parties agree that the Decommissioning process of the Project may commence (and the funds to pay for the cost of any such Decommissioning from the Bond may be called on) for the following reasons, each (a "Triggering Event"):

- (a) Owner provides written notice to the City of its intent to retire or decommission the Project (the 'Owner Decommissioning Notice")
- (b) Commercial operation of the Project has not started within eighteen (18) months of the completion of construction, or
- (c) The Project "ceases to be operational" (as defined below) in its entirety for more than twelve (12) consecutive months.

In event the Owner fails to initiate Decommissioning of the Project within one-hundred eighty (180) days after providing Owner Decommissioning Notice, as defined in Triggering Event (a), or Owner fails to provide a reasonable explanation for the delay in the construction or cessation of operation of the Project, then the City may commence Decommissioning of the Project through use of the Bond, provided that the City issues a notice to Owner and Landowner (the "City Decommissioning Notice") and allows the Owner thirty (30) days to respond to the City Decommissioning Notice prior to the commencement of Decommissioning. For the purposes of this Agreement, "ceases to be operational" shall mean no generation of electricity, other than due to repairs to the Project or causes beyond the reasonable control of Owner. Any one of the events outlined in this Section 3 shall be deemed a Triggering Event based upon which the City shall have the right to demand Decommissioning.

- 4. Upon the occurrence of any of the Triggering Events in Section 3 above, the City shall have the right, but not the obligation, to perform the Decommissioning itself if the Owner or its successors or assigns, or any other person under whose control the Project fails, refuses, or neglects to initiate the Decommissioning within one-hundred eighty (180) days of such occurrence. In such event, Owner (or its successors or assigns) and Landowner (or any of Landowner's heirs or assigns) agrees to give the City right of reasonable access on Landowner's property to decommission the Project and shall defend, hold harmless and indemnify the City for any and all claims, liability, loss or damage arising out of its exercise of its right to decommission this Project as provided for herein, except in cases of negligence by the City or any of its contractors or agents. For clarity, nothing in this Section 4 or this Agreement shall infer any obligation or responsibility, financial or otherwise, to Landowner (or any of Landowner's assigns) for any costs of Decommissioning the Project.
- 5. Upon removal of the infrastructure and disposal of the components of the Project from the site on which the Project is built, and restoration of the properties to their pre-project state, or to the condition designed by a subsequent Owner or developer as agreed upon with the Landowner and the City, then the Owner shall have no further obligation to the City.
- 6. This Agreement may not be amended or modified except by written instrument signed and delivered by the Parties. This Agreement is binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the Parties and their respective administrators, successors and assigns. In accordance with the provisions of section 109 of the New York General Municipal Law, Owner and Landowner are prohibited from assigning, transferring, conveying, subletting or otherwise disposing of this Agreement, or of any right, title or interest in this Agreement, or its power to execute this Agreement, to any other person or corporation without the previous consent in writing of the City, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed.

- 7. Owner shall provide the City with proof that it either carries sufficient Workers' Compensation insurance coverage for its employees in New York or that it is exempt from such requirement.
- 8. The Parties agree to execute and deliver any additional documents or take any further action as reasonably requested by another Party to effectuate the purpose of this Agreement.

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport Planning Board reviewed the proposed project and recommended approval to the Mayor and Common Council of the City of Lockport; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lockport Common Council, on Wednesday, October 7, 2020, did hold a duly advertised Public Hearing at Municipal Building, One Locks Plaza, Lockport, New York 14094 regarding the application for a Special Use Permit for a solar energy system located at **219 Summit Street**, Lockport, New York 14094 and at such public hearing every party wishing to be heard was heard; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council has considered all relevant testimony, documents, and all other information presented and placed before it;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that based on the testimony, documents, and other information presented, the Common Council makes the following findings:

- a. That the use, solar energy system, is designed, located and proposed to be operated so the public health, safety, welfare and convenience will be protected; *to wit*: the project has been designed and located such that the solar panels will be behind structures and vegetation substantially reducing its visibility and impact to neighboring properties and public highways, the project is also located in a sparsely populated area of the City, and
- b. That the use, solar energy system, will not cause substantial injury to the value of other property in the neighborhood where it is located, *to wit*: the project has been designed and located, such that the solar panels will be behind structures and vegetation thus substantially reducing its visibility and impact to neighboring properties, berms and landscaping have also been made part of the project to reduce visibility to neighbors, and the applicant has exceeded the setbacks required under the City Code for distances from neighboring properties, structures and lot lines; and
- c. That the use, solar energy system, will be compatible with adjoining development and the character of the neighborhood where it is located, *to wit*: the neighborhood the project is located in is zoned residential. However, it generally consists of large lots with a few single-family homes and/or large farming operations and woods. The parcels are also within close proximity to the Transit Road commercial corridor. The character of the neighborhood where the project is located will not be affected since the project has been designed to substantially minimize and obscure the solar panels from view of neighboring properties and public highways; and

- d. That the use, solar energy system, provide adequate screening to preserve the character of the neighborhood, *to wit*: the project does require a berm and additional landscape plantings; and
- e. That the use, solar energy system, provide adequate off-street and loading and the special use will not substantially interfere with traffic on abutting streets, *to wit*: while the project will cause an increase in traffic on Summit Street and Ruhlmann Road during construction that impact is not expected to be substantial and will be limited in time to only the period of construction. The nature of the project does not require the presence of employees or other staff beyond periods of required maintenance, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Use Permit for operation of solar energy system at 219 Summit Street is approved with the following conditions:

- A. Landscape buffering consistent with the landscape plan submitted by or on behalf of **OYA Ruhlmann B LLC** with the continuous live vegetation, evergreen trees planted in a staggered format, forever green, dense, and sufficiently high to block view of the fence and solar energy system at ground level from the street and neighboring properties; and
- B. Solar farms are to be constructed and operated in accordance with the Guidelines for Agricultural Mitigation for Solar Energy Projects (rev. dated 4/19/2018).
 - C. Decommissioning Plan.
- 1. At the completion of construction of the Project (the "Start Date"), **OYA Ruhlmann B LLC**, its successors and assigns (hereinafter the "Owner") shall post a Decommissioning Bond (the "Bond") for the benefit of the City in the amount set forth in Table 4 of the Decommissioning Plan submitted to the Planning Board and City of Lockport. At the end of each one-year period following the Start Date (the "Anniversary Date"), Owner shall renew the Bond according to the Decommissioning Bond Value Schedule in Table 4 of the Decommissioning Plan. Upon posting of the Bond, the Owner will provide a copy of the related Bond policy with contact information for the financial provider. Owner or its successor in title to this Project shall be responsible for renewing such Bond as long as the system remains in commercial operation, which is expected to be for a period of thirty-five (35) years.

The Parties agree that the Bond shall be used solely to pay for any Decommissioning costs of the Project. Owner shall have no further payment obligations in connection with Decommissioning during the operation of the Project provided that Owner complies with posting the Bond in accordance with this Agreement. Nonetheless, in the event the actual Decommissioning costs exceed the amount covered by the Bond, Owner or its successor in title to this Project shall be responsible for any such excess costs, provided such excess costs are not as a result of the City using any amount covered by the Bond for any reason other than to pay for Decommissioning costs of the Project. In the event the City uses any amount from the Bond for any reason other than to pay for Decommissioning costs related to the Project, the City shall be responsible to pay for such amount used and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner and Landowner of the Project from any claim, loss, damage, liability or costs (including any reasonable attorney costs) arising from the City's use of the funds.

2. Decommissioning as used in this Agreement shall mean the removal and disposal of all structures, equipment and accessories, including subsurface foundations and all other

material, concrete, or debris, that were installed in connection with the Project and the reasonable restoration of the parcel of land on which the Project is built to either of the following, at the Landowner's option ("Decommissioning"): (i) the condition such lands were in prior to the development, construction and operation of the Project, including restoration, regrading, and reseeding, or (ii) the condition designed by a subsequent Owner or developer as agreed upon with the Landowner and the City. Costs of Decommissioning under this agreement include labor, professional services and any other costs reasonably associated with such restoration.

- 3. The Parties agree that the Decommissioning process of the Project may commence (and the funds to pay for the cost of any such Decommissioning from the Bond may be called on) for the following reasons, each (a "Triggering Event"):
 - a. Owner provides written notice to the City of its intent to retire or decommission the Project (the 'Owner Decommissioning Notice")
 - b. Commercial operation of the Project has not started within eighteen (18) months of the completion of construction, or
 - c. The Project "ceases to be operational" (as defined below) in its entirety for more than twelve (12) consecutive months.

In event the Owner fails to initiate Decommissioning of the Project within one-hundred eighty (180) days after providing Owner Decommissioning Notice, as defined in Triggering Event (a), or Owner fails to provide a reasonable explanation for the delay in the construction or cessation of operation of the Project, then the City may commence Decommissioning of the Project through use of the Bond, provided that the City issues a notice to Owner and Landowner (the "City Decommissioning Notice") and allows the Owner thirty (30) days to respond to the City Decommissioning Notice prior to the commencement of Decommissioning. For the purposes of this Agreement, "ceases to be operational" shall mean no generation of electricity, other than due to repairs to the Project or causes beyond the reasonable control of Owner. Any one of the events outlined in this Section 3 shall be deemed a Triggering Event based upon which the City shall have the right to demand Decommissioning.

4. Upon the occurrence of any of the Triggering Events in Section 3 above, the City shall have the right, but not the obligation, to perform the Decommissioning itself if the Owner or its successors or assigns, or any other person under whose control the Project fails, refuses, or neglects to initiate the Decommissioning within one-hundred eighty (180) days of such occurrence. In such event, Owner (or its successors or assigns) and Landowner (or any of Landowner's heirs or assigns) agrees to give the City right of reasonable access on Landowner's property to decommission the Project and shall defend, hold harmless and indemnify the City for any and all claims, liability, loss or damage arising out of its exercise of its right to decommission this Project as provided for herein, except in cases of negligence by the City or any of its contractors or agents. For clarity, nothing in this Section 4 or this Agreement shall infer any obligation or responsibility, financial or otherwise, to Landowner (or any of Landowner's assigns) for any costs of Decommissioning the Project.

- 5. Upon removal of the infrastructure and disposal of the components of the Project from the site on which the Project is built, and restoration of the properties to their pre-project state, or to the condition designed by a subsequent Owner or developer as agreed upon with the Landowner and the City, then the Owner shall have no further obligation to the City.
- 6. This Agreement may not be amended or modified except by written instrument signed and delivered by the Parties. This Agreement is binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the Parties and their respective administrators, successors and assigns. In accordance with the provisions of section 109 of the New York General Municipal Law, Owner and Landowner are prohibited from assigning, transferring, conveying, subletting or otherwise disposing of this Agreement, or of any right, title or interest in this Agreement, or its power to execute this Agreement, to any other person or corporation without the previous consent in writing of the City, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed.
- 7. Owner shall provide the City with proof that it either carries sufficient Workers' Compensation insurance coverage for its employees in New York or that it is exempt from such requirement.

Whereas, the proposed actions involve a special use permit and site plan review and are therefore actions under Article 8 of the New York State Environmental Conservation Law – the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQR"); and

Whereas, Ruhlmann Farm Acres LLC, OYA Ruhlmann A LLC and OYA Ruhlmann B LLC ("Applicants") have applied to the City of Lockport ("City") for a Special Use Permit and Site Plan Review for two solar energy systems on the above listed properties, and

Whereas, the proposed action is a Type I, and

Whereas, the Common Council issued a Notice of Intent to be Lead Agency in order to have a coordinated review, and no other agency has objected to the City assuming Lead Agency, the time for such comment or objection has passed, and the Common Council declared Lead Agency Status on September 17, 2020 by Resolution No. 091620.4, and

Whereas, the Common Council for the City of Lockport, in performing the lead agency function in accordance with SEQR (i) thoroughly reviewed the Long Form Environmental Assessment Form (the "Long EAF"), Part I, and any and all other documents prepared and submitted with respect to this proposed action and its environmental review and public comments, (ii) thoroughly analyzed the potential relevant areas of environmental concern to determine if the proposed actions may have a significant adverse impact on the environment, including the criteria in 6 NYCRR §617.7 (c), and (iii) completed the Long EAF, Part II:

Whereas, the Common Council for the City of Lockport identified the relevant areas of environmental concern and has taken a hard look at each of the identified areas as required by "SEQRA". The Common Council for the City of Lockport compared the proposed Action with the criteria for determining significance identified in 6 NYCRR § 617.7(c)(1) and in accordance with 6 NYCRR § 617.7(c)(2) and (3). As indicated below in the discussion of each criterion specified in 6 NYCRR § 617.7(c)(1), the Action will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved as Follows:

That the Common Council for the City of Lockport has reviewed the Environmental Assessment Forms (EAF) and the criteria contained in 6 NYCRR §617.7, as well as the applications and the comments at the public hearing, and has determined that the Projects will not have a significant impact on the environment for the following reasons:

- A. As required by §617.7(a)(2), the Common Council for the City of Lockport has determined that an Environmental Impact Statement is not required because any identified adverse impacts on the environment will not be significant.
- B. As required by §617.7(b), the Common Council for the City of Lockport has:
 - 1. Considered the action as defined in subdivisions 617.2(b) and 617.3(g).
 - 2. Reviewed the Full EAF for each of the projects, the criteria identified in 617.7(c) and other supporting information to identify relevant areas of environmental concern.
 - 3. Analyzed the identified relevant areas of environmental concern to determine whether the action will have a significant adverse impact.
 - 4. Set forth herein its written Finding of No Significant Environmental Impact.
- C. The Board has compared the impacts reasonably expected to result from the proposed action to the criteria listed in 617.7(c)(1) as indicators of significant adverse impacts:
- (i) a substantial adverse change in existing air quality, ground or surface water quality or quantity, traffic, or noise levels; a substantial increase in solid waste production; a substantial increase in potential for erosion, flooding, leaching or drainage problems;

a. <u>Traffic Impacts</u>

The Project will not have a significant adverse impact upon traffic or transportation. This Action involves short-term impacts from construction period and decommissioning period traffic utilizing the existing road network. Operations period traffic is insignificant.

b. Noise Impacts

There will be no significant adverse noise impacts from the Project.

c. Air Quality Impacts

The Project will not create a significant adverse impact to air quality, the only impacts will be short-term disturbances during construction and decommissioning.

d. Wetland Impacts

There are no wetlands impacts.

e. Erosion, Flooding and Drainage Impacts

The Project will comply with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations, including compliance with the Clean Water Act and the requirement to obtain applicable permits for stormwater discharges from construction activities. The Project will comply with the submitted Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan. There will be no impacts.

f. Solid Waste Production

The proposed Project will not increase solid waste production. The decommissioned system and construction waste will be disposed of in accordance with State regulations.

(ii) the removal or destruction of large quantities of vegetation or fauna; substantial interference with the movement of any resident or migratory fish or wildlife species; impacts on a significant habitat area; substantial adverse impacts on a threatened or endangered species of animal or plant, or the habitat of such a species; or other significant adverse impacts to natural resources;

While the site is agricultural property located in the Niagara County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Plan there will be no interference with the movement of any resident or migratory fish or wildlife species. The property is not a significant habitat area and there will be no substantial adverse impacts on any threatened or endangered species of animal or plant, or the habitat of such a species, nor other significant adverse impacts to natural resources.

(iii) the impairment of the environmental characteristics of a Critical Environmental Area as designated pursuant to subdivision 617.14(g) of this Part;

There is no Critical Environmental Area within the Project area, thus there will be no significant adverse impacts.

(iv) the creation of a material conflict with a community's current plans or goals as officially approved or adopted;

The proposed Project is consistent with the Town's current plans and goals, which specifically authorizes solar projects.

(v) the impairment of the character or quality of important historical, archeological, architectural, or aesthetic resources or of existing community or neighborhood character;

This Project will be fully screened by multiple rows of landscaping which must be maintained through the life of the Project. The Project will be located in a zone designated by the City Code as appropriate for solar, and will not negatively impact neighborhood character. The Project will not impair the character or quality of important historical, archeological, architectural, or aesthetic resources.

(vi) a major change in the use of either the quantity or type of energy;

There will be no negative impacts, the Project will increase the supply of renewable energy.

(vii) the creation of a hazard to human health;

There will be no such impacts.

(viii) a substantial change in the use, or intensity of use, of land including agricultural, open space or recreational resources, or in its capacity to support existing uses;

There will be no such impacts. The proposed Project does not represent a substantial change in the use or intensity of use of land from current law, the land will be returned to agricultural use after decommissioning.

(ix) the encouraging or attracting of a large number of people to a place or places for more than a few days, compared to the number of people who would come to such place absent the action;

There will be no such impacts.

(x) the creation of a material demand for other actions that would result in one of the above consequences;

There will be no such impacts.

(xi) changes in two or more elements of the environment, no one of which has a significant impact on the environment, but when considered together result in a substantial adverse impact on the environment; or

There will be no such impacts.

(xii) two or more related actions undertaken, funded, or approved by an agency, none of which has or would have a significant impact on the environment, but when considered cumulatively would meet one or more of the criteria in this subdivision

Resolved, that the Common Council for the City of Lockport based upon (i) its thorough review of the Long EAF, Part I, and any and all other documents prepared and submitted with respect to the proposed actions and its environmental review, (ii) its thorough review of the potential relevant areas of environmental concern to determine if the proposed action may have a significant adverse impact on the environment, including the criteria identified in 6 NYCRR (c), and (iii) its completion of the Long EAF, Part II, including the findings noted thereon (which findings are incorporated herein as if set forth at length), hereby makes a negative determination of environmental significance ("Negative Declaration") in accordance with SEQR for the above-referenced proposed action, and determines that an Environmental Impact Statement will not be required, and be it further
