Whereas, the following bids were received and publicly opened by the City of Lockport on Thursday, October 21, 2021 at 11:00 am: JCI Jones Chemicals, Inc., \$3,000 per ton for chlorine; Usalco, \$1.6017 per gallon, Kemira Water Solutions, \$1.98 per gallon, Holland Company, Inc., \$2.51 per gallon, and Allied Specialties, Inc., \$3.13 per gallon for polyaluminum chloride; and, Univar Solutions USA, Inc., \$2.48 per gallon, PVS Nolwood Chemicals, Inc., \$2.975 per gallon, and Slack Chemical Co., Inc., \$7.984 per gallon for hydrofluorosilicic acid, and

Whereas, the contracts will be awarded solely from the bids received; and Whereas, the Chief Water Treatment Plant Operator has reviewed the bids and recommends awarding the contract to each of the low bidders; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Mayor, subject to Corporation Counsel approval, is hereby authorized and directed to sign contracts with JCI Jones Chemicals, Inc. for chlorine, Usalco for polyaluminum chloride, and Univar Solutions USA, Inc. for hydrofluorosilicic acid for January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022.
