WHEREAS Zeton US Properties, Inc. (Zeton) has applied for a Special Use Permit for 115 Oakhurst to utilize an existing single-family home while simultaneously operating an industrial use; and

WHEREAS the Planning Board, at its March 6, 2023 meeting, recommended the special use permit to utilize the existing single-family dwelling home on the parcel at 115 Oakhurst Street, while simultaneously operating an industrial use situated in an I-2 Zone, with the stipulation that the utilization of the single-family home is valid for the current tenants occupying the home only; and

WHEREAS, at the April 26, 2023 meeting of the Common Council, a public hearing on the special use permit application was held, with no opposition thereto; now be it

RESOLVED that Zeton is granted a special use permit in accordance with the recommendations of the Planning Board during the tenancy of the current occupants of the single-family residence at 115 Oakhurst Street, while simultaneously utilizing the property for a permitted industrial use be and the same is hereby approved; subject to the following provisions:

No change in the character of the neighborhood

No excessive noise or disturbance of neighborhood

- No appreciable change in traffic
- No outside storage materials

RESOLVED that the special use permit shall go to the applicant only and shall terminate on the sale or transfer of the property (if other than the applicant) and further it terminates if the use permit is abandoned for more than one year. Whereas, the Fire Chief has collected a quote for the cardiac monitor from Zoll Medical Corporation totaling \$38,255.31 under cooperative bidding NPP Gov contract number PS20200; and

Resolved, the City is authorized to enter into said purchasing agreements with Stryker and Zoll Medical Corporation; and
