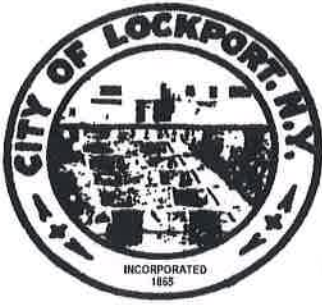

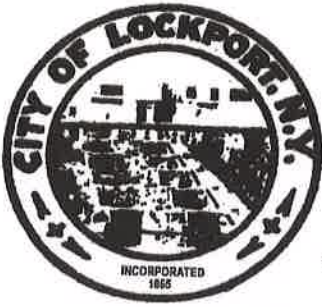

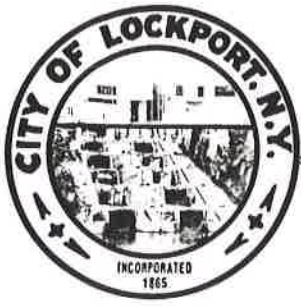

To Whom It May Concern:

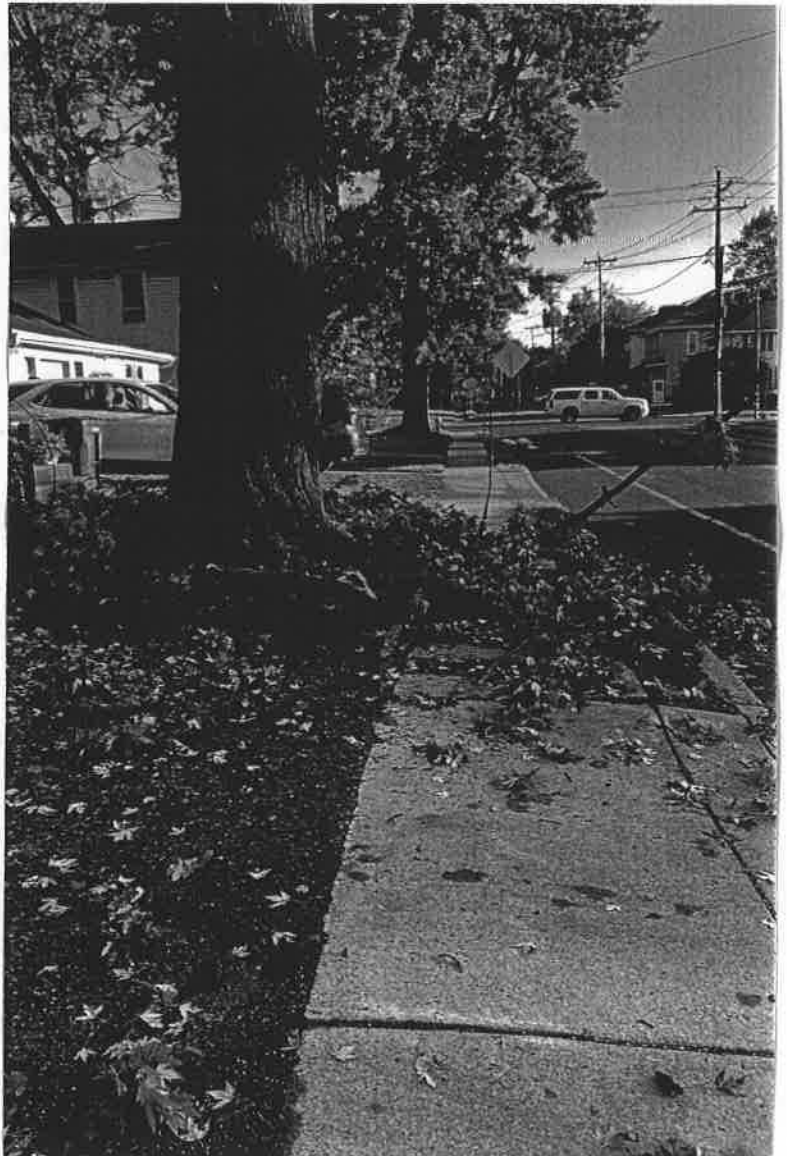

CITY OF LOCKPORT AND TOWN OF LOCKPORT SEWER AGREEMENT

This Agreement made this ___ day of _____ 2023, by and between the City of Lockport, New York, a municipal corporation, organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, with its principal office located at One Locks Plaza, Lockport, New York, hereinafter referred to as the "City"; and the Town of Lockport, New York, a municipal corporation, organized and existing under the laws of the State of New York, on behalf of Carlisle Gardens Sewer District No. 1, Lincoln Village Sewer District No. 2, and the Town of Lockport Sewer District No. 3, constituting all of the Sewer districts in the Town of Lockport, with its principal office located at 6560 Dysinger Road, Lockport, New York, hereinafter referred to as the "Town".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the City, pursuant to the Agreement dated December 17, 1969, and multiple amendments thereto, accepted sewage from the Town sewage collection system; and

WHEREAS, the City and Town entered into a new agreement dated August 6, 2003, running from January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2006; and

WHEREAS, the City and Town entered into an extension of said Agreement running from January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the parties entered into a renewal of said Agreement for the additional period of two years from December 31, 2010 through December 31, 2012, and then an extension of said Agreement

for a period of three years from January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2018, and a further three year extension from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2021; and a further two year extension from January 1 2022 through December 31, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to extend and renew said Agreement for an additional two years from January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2025, with the additional option of another two year extension, upon agreement of both parties hereto.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED

- (1) For the period from January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024, the amount of consideration the Town shall pay to the City is \$693,406.30, representing an increase of 3% from the preceding year.
- (2) For the period from January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025, the amount of consideration the Town shall pay to the City is \$714,208.48, representing an increase of 3% from the preceding year.
- (3) Each and every provision of said Agreement dated August 6, 2003, is hereby renewed and shall remain in effect through December 31, 2025, except as modified herein.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this Agreement to be executed on the dates set forth below, and is effective retroactively to the date of January 1, 2024.
