Whereas, the Project is located within the boundaries of the City of Lockport; and Whereas, OAHS shall agree to make payments in lieu of Real Estate Taxes ("PILOT Payments") pursuant to the this Agreement with respect to the Project; and

Whereas, the PILOT Payments contemplated by this Agreement are in lieu of Real Estate Taxes which may be payable with respect to the Project during the term of this Agreement;

Now, therefore, in consideration of the matters above recited, for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged by the parties, the Mayor is hereby directed and authorized to enter into the PILOT agreement with OAHS, subject to Corporation Counsel review.

(1) The payments in lieu of taxes ("PILOT") period is to commence on January 1, 2024 (the Commencement Date), and be concurrent with the Project's use as apartment units for the community, but shall in no event exceed forty (40)

years from the Commencement Date as authorized in the Public Housing Finance Law.

- (2) Beginning with the first fiscal year following the Commencement Date, and continuing through the fortieth (40th) fiscal tax year following, OAHS shall make annual payments in lieu of general real estate taxes on the property located at 77 Main Street, Lockport, commonly known as Urban Park Tower, in the amount of \$61,353.00 with a two percent (2%) annual escalation. Such payments shall be due and payable on January 1st of each year.
- (3) In the event of a default in payment of the PILOT agreement contemplated by this resolution, the City shall retain all rights afforded it under law and the PILOT Agreement.

BOND ORDINANCE DATED FEBRUARY 8, 2023.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,717,191 BONDS OF THE CITY OF LOCKPORT, NIAGARA COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF THE PURCHASE OF A FIRE-FIGHTING VEHICLE, IN AND FOR SAID CITY.

WHEREAS, the capital project hereinafter described has been determined to be a Type II Action of the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, the implementation of which as proposed, such regulations provide, will not result in any significant adverse environmental impact; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize the financing thereof, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the affirmative vote of not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength of the Common Council of the City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The purchase of a fire-fighting vehicle, for the City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, including original apparatus and equipment, and incidental expenses in connection therewith, is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$1,717,191.

<u>Section 2.</u> It is hereby determined that the plan for the financing of said specific object or purpose is by the issuance of \$1,717,191 bonds of said City hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 3.</u> It is hereby further determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is twenty years, pursuant to subdivision 27 of paragraph (a) of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 4.</u> The faith and credit of said City of Lockport, Niagara County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be

levied on all the taxable real property of said City, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such obligations as the same become due and payable.

<u>Section 5.</u> Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the City Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of said City. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said City Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. All other matters, except as provided herein relating to such bonds herein authorized including date, denominations, maturities, interest payment dates, and whether said bonds shall be repaid in accordance with a schedule providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the City Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of such City. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals in addition to those required by section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the City Treasurer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

<u>Section 7.</u> This ordinance shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this ordinance, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

<u>Section 8.</u> The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- 1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said City is not authorized to expend money, or
- 2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this bond ordinance are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- 3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 9. This ordinance, which takes effect immediately upon the adoption thereof, shall be published in summary form in the official newspaper of said City, together with a notice of the City Clerk in substantially the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law

Procurement Policy

WHEREAS, Section 104-b of the General Municipal Law (GML) requires every city to adopt internal policies and procedures governing all procurement of goods and services notsubject to the bidding requirements of GML, Section 103 or any other law; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Lockport does hereby adopt the following procurement policies and procedures:

Guideline #1: Every prospective purchase of goods or services shall be evaluated to determine the applicability of GML Section 103. Every city officer, board, department head or other personnel with the requisite purchasing authority (hereinafter purchaser) shall estimate the cumulative amount of the items of supply or equipment needed in given fiscal year. That estimate shall include the canvass of other city departments and past history to determine the likely yearly value of the commodity to be acquired. The information gathered and conclusions reached shall be documented and kept with the file or other documentation supporting the purchase activity.

Guideline #2: All purchase contracts which will exceed \$20,000 in the fiscal year or public works contracts over \$35,000 shall be formal bid pursuant to GML Section 103.

Guideline #3A: For the Purchase of Commodities, Equipment, or Goods (Non-Public

Works):

Dollar Limit \$1 - \$2,999	Procedure At the discretion of the Department Head
\$3,000 - \$4,999	Documented oral/written/emailed quotes from at least three vendors
\$5,000 - \$19,999 vendors	Formal written/emailed quotes from at least three separate
\$20,000 and up 53	Sealed bids in conformance with General Municipal Law, Section

Guideline #3B: For the Purchase of Public Works Projects/Contracts:

Dollar Limit \$1 - \$2,999	Procedure At the discretion of the Department Head
\$3,000 - \$4,999	Documented oral/written/emailed quotes from at least three vendors
\$5,000 - \$34,999	Formal written/emailed quotes from at least three separate vendors
\$35,000 and up	Sealed bids in conformance with General Municipal Law, Section 53

Any written RFP shall describe the desired goods, quantity and the particulars of delivery. The purchaser shall compile a list of all vendors from whom written/fax/oral quotes have been requested and the written/fax/oral quotes offered. One quotation must be obtained from a local vendor, if possible. All information gathered in complying withthe procedures of this guideline shall be preserved and filed with the documentation supporting the subsequent purchase order and provided to the Principle Account Clerk in the Finance Department.

Guideline #4: The lowest responsible proposal or quote shall be awarded the purchase or public works contract unless the purchaser prepares a written justification providing reasons why it is inthe best interest of the City and its taxpayers to make an award to other than the low bidder. Local vendors may be given a five percent (5%) price benefit for the contracts less than \$20,000 in determining lowest bid. If a bidder is not deemed responsible, facts supporting that judgment shall also be documented and filed with the record supporting the procurement.

Guideline #5: A good faith effort shall be made to obtain the required number of proposals or quotations. If the purchaser is unable to obtain the required number of proposals or quotations, the purchaser shall document the attempt made at obtaining the proposals. In no event shall theinability to obtain the proposals or quotes be a bar

to the procurement.

Guideline #6: No solicitation of written proposals or quotations shall be required under the following circumstances (but must still be documented with the attached worksheet):

- Emergencies, as defined by General Municipal Law Section 53 (4)/ 103 (4);
- Sole source situations;
- Goods purchased from agencies for the blind or severely handicapped;
- Goods purchased from correctional facilities;
- Goods purchased from or through another governmental agency (such as Sourcewell);
- Goods purchased at auction;
- Goods purchased through a governmental (local/State/or Federal) contract (needs approval with a Council Resolution when substituting for the sealed bidding procedures).
- Professional services; defined as a service requiring special or technical skill, training, or expertise, to be chosen based on accountability, reliability, responsibility, skill, education and training, judgement, integrity, and moral worth.

Guideline #7: Departments are responsible for ensuring that procurement policy guidelines are withheld in their departments. Any other employee making purchases shall act subject to the direction of the department head responsible for purchasing.

Guideline #8: For federally funded projects or activities subject to Section 3 of 24 CFR Part 135 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, the City will, to the greatest extent feasible, facilitate participation of Section 3 residents and Section 3 businesses in the procurement of goods and services pursuant to its Section 3 Participation Plan. Solicitation may be undertaken via advertisements in local publications encouraging Section 3 participation, or direct outreach by letter or email to identified Section 3 businesses or individuals included on the Department of Housing and Urban Development's Section 3 Businesses Registry. The City's established purchase/ contracting thresholds will apply. The City will keep documentation of Section 3 solicitation in its records and any response(s) thereto.

Guideline #9: In an effort to affirmatively increase procurement and contracting opportunities for minority- and women-owned business enterprises, the City will solicit MBEs and/or WBEs as part of its procurement process, when appropriate. Solicitation may be undertaken via advertisements in minority publications or direct outreach by letter or email to identified State-certified M/WBEs, or by working with a clearinghouse such as the Syracuse Minority Business Development Center. The City's established purchase/contracting thresholds will apply. For purposes of the above, the M/WBE must be certified by Empire State Development (ESD) through the Division of Minority and Women Business Development (DMWBD). The City will keep documentation of M/WBE solicitation in its records and any responses thereto.

Guideline #10: This policy shall be reviewed annually by the City of Lockport Common Council.

Budget Amendment Policy

WHEREAS, in compliance with the New York State Office of the Comptroller, all governmental entities are recommended to have and maintain a budget modification policy that identifies appropriate practices and regulation as they relate to City finances; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Lockport does hereby adopt the following budget modification policies and procedures:

Guideline #1: Department Heads, throughout the year, may encounter budget line items that require additional funding for operational costs. The first priority is to utilize unused excess funds within their department. If they can identify matching excess funds in their department to be reduced in the same amount of the requested increase, the Department Head may request an individual amendment amounting from \$1 to \$10,000 within their budget, to be posted in New World by said Department's Account Clerk and subsequently reviewed, approved, and posted by the Director of Finance (without the need to fill out and submit the attached Budget Amendment Worksheet). In the event that the Department Head cannot identify excess funds in their department to cover the requested budgetary increase, they are to follow Guideline #4.

Guideline #2: For individual amendment amounts ranging from **\$10,001** to **\$25,000** (in which the Department Head can identify excess funds to match the requested increase), the Department Head will provide to the Director of Finance the attached Budget Amendment Worksheet. In this event, the Director of Finance shall have the authorization:

 To approve requests for the transfer of funds, not to exceed \$25,000, within and between the contractual, capital, and benefit expense items of a department budget, provided said administrative transfers do not exceed total appropriations for the departmental budget as adopted or amended by the City Council. To approve requests for the transfer of funds, not to exceed \$25,000, within the Personal Services account or from Personal Services to Equipment and Contractual, provided said authority is further limited to modifications for temporary, overtime and/or shift differential appropriations, which shall not result in the creation of permanent full time or part-time positions.

Guideline #3: For individual amendments ranging from **\$25,001** to **\$50,000** (in which the Department Head can identify excess funds to match the requested increase), the Department Head will provide to the Director of Finance the attached Budget Amendment Worksheet. In this event, the Director of Finance in concurrence with the Mayor, shall have the authorization:

- To approve requests for the transfer of funds which exceed \$25,000 but are less than \$50,000 within and between the equipment and contractual areas of the department budget, provided said transfers do not exceed total appropriations for the departmental budget as adopted or amended by the City Council.
- To approve requests for the transfer of funds which exceed \$25,000 but are less than \$50,000 within the Personal Services account or from Personal Services to Equipment and Contractual, provided said authority is further limited to modifications for temporary, overtime and/or shift differential appropriations, which shall not result in the creation of permanent full time or part-time positions.

Guideline #4: Common Council approval shall be required for all other budget amendments, including requests that transfer funds from one department to another, as well as the use of contingency. In these events, the Department Head will provide to the Director of Finance the attached Budget Amendment Worksheet, which will then be reviewed by the Finance Director and submitted (in resolution format) to the Clerk's Office for the Common Council to vote on. Department Heads must provide this form to the Finance Director at least two weeks before the Common Council meeting they wish this amendment to be voted on.

Guideline #5: In all instances, there shall be no splitting of transfer amounts to avoid the next level of authorization.

Guideline #6: This policy shall be reviewed annually by the City of Lockport Common Council.

Investment Policy

WHEREAS, in compliance with the New York State Office of the Comptroller, all governmental entities are recommended to have and maintain an investment policy that identifies appropriate practices and regulation as they relate to City finances; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Lockport does hereby adopt the following investment policies and procedures:

Guideline #1 - Scope: This investment policy applies to all moneys and other financial resources available for investment on its own behalf or on behalf of any other entity or individual.

Guideline #2 - Objectives: The primary objectives of the local government's investment activities are, in priority order,

- to conform with all applicable federal, state and other legal requirements (legal);
- to adequately safeguard principal (safety);
- to provide sufficient liquidity to meet all operating requirements (liquidity); and
- to obtain the optimum rate of return (yield).

Guideline #3 - Delegation of Authority: The governing board's responsibility for administration of the investment program is delegated to the City Treasurer who shall establish written procedures for the operation of the investment program consistent with these investment guidelines. Such procedures shall include an adequate internal control structure to provide a satisfactory level of accountability based on a data base or records incorporating description and amounts of investments, transaction dates, and other relevant information and regulate the activities of subordinate employees.

Guideline #4 - Prudence: All participants in the investment process shall seek to act responsibly as custodians of the public trust and shall avoid any transaction that might impair public confidence in the City of Lockport to govern effectively. Investments shall be made with judgement and care, under circumstances then prevailing, which persons of prudence discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investments, considering the safety of the principal as well as the probable income to be derived. All participants involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution of the investment program, or which could impair their ability to make impartial investment decisions.

Guideline #5 - Diversification: It is the policy of the City of Lockport to diversify its deposits and investments by financial institution, and by maturity scheduling.

Guideline #6 – Internal Controls: It is the policy of the City of Lockport for all moneys collected by any officer or employee of the government to transfer those funds to the (chief fiscal officer) within 30 days of deposit, or within the time period specified in law, whichever is shorter. The City Treasurer is responsible for establishing and maintaining an internal control structure to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that deposits and investments are safeguarded against loss from unauthorized use or disposition, that transactions are executed in accordance with management's authorization and recorded properly, and are managed in compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

Guideline #7 – Designation of Depositories: The banking institutions authorized for the deposit of monies are to be designated by Council resolution as required by City Charter, Section C-101.

Guideline #8 – Collateralizing of Deposits: In accordance with the provisions of General Municipal Law, #10, all deposits of the City of Lockport, including certificates of deposit and special time deposits, in excess of the amount insured under the provisions of the Federal Deposit Insurance Act shall be secured:

- By a pledge of "eligible securities" with and aggregate "market value" as provided by GML #10, equal to the aggregate amount of deposits from the categories designated in Guideline 13 of this policy.
- By an eligible "irrevocable letter of credit" issued by a qualified bank other than the bank with the deposits in favor of the government for a term not to exceed 90 days with an aggregate value equal to 140% of the aggregate amount of deposits and the agreed upon interest, if any. A qualified bank is one whose commercial paper and other unsecured short-term debt obligations are rated in one of the three highest rating categories by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organizations or by a bank that is in compliance with applicable federal minimum risk-based capital requirements.
- By an eligible surety bond payable to the City of Lockport for an amount at least equal to 100% of the aggregate amount of deposits and agreed upon interest, if any, executed by an insurance company authorized to do business in New York State, and who has met with the requirements of the State Comptroller's office. (#3 added 1/04/95)

Guideline #9 – Safekeeping and Collateralization: Eligible securities used for collateralizing deposits shall be held by the depository and/or a third party bank or trust company subject to security and custodial agreements. The security agreement shall provide that eligible securities are being pledged to secure local government deposits together with agreed upon interest, if any, and any costs or expenses arising out of the collection of such deposits upon default. It shall also provide the conditions under which the securities may be sold, presented for payment, substituted or released and the events which will enable the local government to exercise its rights against the pledged securities. In the event that the securities are not registered or inscribed in the name of the local government, such securities shall be delivered in a form suitable for

transfer or with an assignment to the City of Lockport or its custodial bank.

The custodial agreement shall provide that securities held by the bank or trust company, or agent of and custodian for, the local government, will be kept separate and apart from the general assets of the custodial bank or trust company and will not, in any circumstances, be commingled with or become part of the backing for any other deposit or other liabilities. The agreement should also describe that the custodian shall confirm the receipt, substitution or release of the securities. The agreement shall provide for the frequency of revaluation of eligible securities and for the substitution of securities when a change in the rating of a security may cause ineligibility. Such agreement shall include all provisions necessary to provide the local government a perfected interest in the securities.

Guideline #10 – Permitted Investments: As authorized by General Municipal Law, #11, the City of Lockport authorizes the City Treasurer to invest moneys not required for immediate expenditure for terms not to exceed its projected cash flow needs in the following types of investments:

- Special time deposit accounts;
- · Certificates of deposit;
- Obligations of the United States of America;
- Obligations guaranteed by agencies of the United States of America where the payment of principal and interest are guaranteed by the United State of America;
- Obligations of the State of New York;
- Obligations issued pursuant to LFL #24.00 or 25.00 (with approval of the State Comptroller) by any municipality, school district or district corporation other than the City of
- Lockport;
- Obligations of public authorities, public housing authorities, urban renewal agencies and industrial development agencies where the general State statutes governing such entities or whose specific enabling legislation authorizes such investments.
- Obligations of this local government, but only with any moneys in a reserve fund established pursuant to GML #6-c, 6-d, 6-e, 6-g, 6-h, 6-j, 6-k, 6-l, 6-m, or 6-n.

All investment obligations shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the City of Lockport within such times as the proceeds will be needed to meet expenditures for purposes for which the moneys were provided and, in the case of obligations purchased with the proceeds of bonds or notes, shall be payable or redeemable at the option of the City of Lockport within two years of the date of purchase.

Guideline #11 – Authorized Financial Institutions and Dealer: The financial institutions so designated by the Common Council as outlined in paragraph VII of this policy shall be the authorized institutions approved for investment purposes. All financial institutions with which the City of Treasurer conducts business must be credit worthy. Banks shall provide their most recent Consolidated Report of Condition (Call

Report) at the request of the City of Lockport. Security dealers not affiliated with a bank shall be required to be classified as reporting dealers affiliated with the New York Federal Reserve Bank, as primary dealers. The City Treasurer is responsible for evaluating the financial position.

Guideline #12 – Purchase of Investments: The City Treasurer is authorized to contract for the purchase of investments:

- Directly, including through a repurchase agreement, from an authorized trading partner.
- By participation in a cooperative investment program with another authorized governmental entity pursuant to Article 5G of the General Municipal Law where such program meets all the requirements set forth in the Office of the State Comptroller Opinion No. 88-46, and the specific program has been authorized by the governing board.
- By utilizing an ongoing investment program with an authorized trading partner pursuant to a contract authorized by the governing board.

All purchased obligations, unless registered or inscribed in the name of the local government, shall be purchased through, delivered to and held in the custody of a bank or trust company. Such obligations shall be purchased, sold or presented for redemption or payment by such bank or trust company only in accordance with prior written authorization from the officer authorized to make the investment. All such transactions shall be confirmed in writing to the City of Lockport by the bank or trust company. Any obligation held in the custody of a bank or trust company shall be held pursuant to a written custodial agreement as described in General Municipal Law, #10.

The custodial agreement shall provide that securities held by the bank or trust company, as agent of and custodian for, the local government, will be kept separate and apart

from the general assets of the custodial bank or trust company and will not, in any circumstances, be commingled with or become part of the backing for any other deposit or

other liabilities. The agreement shall describe how the custodian shall confirm the receipt and release of the securities. Such agreement shall include all provisions necessary

to provide the local government a perfected interest in the securities

Guideline #13 – Schedule of Eligible Securities:

- (i) Obligations issued, or fully insured or guaranteed as to the payment of principal and interest, by the United States of America, an agency thereof or a United States government sponsored corporation.
- (ii) Obligations partially insured or guaranteed by any agency of the United States of America, at a proportion of the market Value of the obligation that represents the amount of the insurance or guaranty.
- (iii) Obligations issued or fully insured or guaranteed by the State of New York, obligations issued by a municipal corporation, school district or district corporation

- of such State or obligations of any public benefit corporation which under a specific State statute may be accepted as security for deposit of public moneys.
- (iv) Obligations issued by states (other than the State of New York) of the United States rated in one of the three highest rating categories by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization.
- (v) Obligations of counties, cities and other governmental entities of a state other than the State of New York having the power to levy taxes that are backed by the full faith and credit of such governmental entity and rated in one of the three highest rating categories by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization.
- (vi) Obligations of domestic corporations rated in one of the two highest rating categories by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization.
- (vii) Any mortgage related securities, as defined in the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, which may be purchased by banks under the limitations established by bank regulatory agencies.
- (viii) Commercial paper and banker's acceptances issued by a bank, other than the Bank, rated in the highest short term category by at least one nationally recognized statistical rating organization and having maturities of not longer than 60 days from the date they are pledged.
- (ix) Zero coupon obligations of the United States government marketed as "Treasury strips".

Guideline #14 – Annual Review: An annual review of the investment policy should be undertaken to determine whether modifications are appropriate.

Fund Balance Policy

WHEREAS, in compliance with the New York State Office of the Comptroller, all governmental entities are recommended to have and maintain a fund balance policy that identifies appropriate fund balance levels as they relate to our cash flow, annual budgets, and contingency; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Lockport does hereby adopt the following fund balance policies and procedures:

Guideline #1 – Use of Fund Balance: Fund balance is the accumulation of prior years' excess or deficit of all revenues and expense. For the purposes of the budget, revenue and expense activity includes bond proceeds and debt service. Available fund balances shall not be used for ongoing operating expenditures, unless a determination has been made that available balances are in excess of required guidelines and plans have been established to address any future operating budget shortfalls. Emphasis shall be placed on one—time uses that achieve future operating cost reductions and/or service level efficiencies.

Guideline #2 – General Fund: The City shall maintain a minimum unrestricted fund balance in the General Fund equal to 20% of the following year's General Fund budgeted expenditures to be used for cash flow purposes, to cover unanticipated expenditures of a non–recurring nature, to meet unexpected increases in service delivery costs and/or to cover unexpected revenue shortfalls. These funds are used to avoid cash flow interruptions, generate interest income, and to avoid the need for short–term borrowing. Each year, the City shall budget an operating budget contingency of not less than 1.25% of all budgeted General Fund expenditures

Guideline #3 – Non-General Governmental Funds: The appropriate balances shall be the amount needed to maintain positive cash balances throughout the year with exceptions made for those funds associated with economic development purposes which may be aggregated by fund type to maintain a positive balance. An adequate operating contingency expense shall be budgeted to provide for business interruption costs and other unanticipated or unbudgeted expenditures. Enterprise funds shall also maintain adequate reserves for emergency improvements relating to new regulations, or emergency needs for capital repair or replacement.

Guideline #4 – Enterprise Funds: The City shall maintain a minimum cash balance in its Enterprise Funds equal to three months of operating expense, or 25% of the funds' annual operating budget. This balance shall be maintained to ensure adequate maintenance reserves, operating cash flow requirements, debt service requirements and legal restrictions. Where cost–effective access to capital markets is available and debt financing is regularly used, replacement balances shall not be maintained in a manner which charges current consumers to pay for future facilities, with exceptions made for those funds associated with economic development purposes. Balances in excess of three months of operating expense may be utilized for capital purchases and replacements in lieu of debt financing if doing so allows for continued maintenance of appropriate balances and funding plans. Alternatively, surplus cash reserves may be used for early debt retirement at the recommendation of the Finance Director and City Treasurer, and approval of the Common Council. Financing decisions shall consider the impact on user rates.

Guideline #5 - Internal Service Funds: To ensure adequate maintenance reserves,

cash flow

balancing requirements, and legal restrictions, the Self–Insurance Funds shall maintain a cash balance equal to the unpaid claim reserves payable amount on its balance sheet, as defined by the independent actuary plus 10% of the annual department operating budgets within the fund. Net position within the fund should not fall below zero.

Guideline #6 – Annual Review: An annual review of cash flow requirements and appropriate fund balances shall be undertaken to determine whether modifications are appropriate for the reserve policy.

The Lockport City Common Council may, in its discretion, use videoconferencing to conduct Common Council and Committee of the Whole meetings, and any other meetings needed to conduct regular and special business.

The Common Council has the authority to determine whether videoconferencing may be utilized under the following circumstances:

- 1. Common Council Aldermen, and the Mayor, must be physically present at any regular or special meeting, or committee meeting, unless an Alderman or the Mayor is unable to attend due to extraordinary circumstances, including, but not limited to: disability, illness, caregiving responsibilities, or any other significant or unexpected factor or event which precludes the Alderman's or Mayor's physical attendance at such meeting.
- 2. A quorum of Aldermen must be present, in person, in the same physical location or locations where the public can attend. In the event that no "in person" quorum is reached, the Aldermen appearing by videoconferencing shall not be permitted to vote at said meeting. No Alderman appearing virtually shall be considered in establishing a quorum. Once an "in person" quorum is reached, the Alderman attending by videoconference may fully participate in said meeting, and vote upon any resolutions presented.
- 3. Except during executive session, the Public shall be permitted to attend the meeting virtually and participate, if applicable, in the event videoconferencing is utilized.
- 4. The public notice for said meeting shall inform the public that videoconferencing will be utilized with the virtual link and physical location of the meeting.
- 5. All resolutions and any relevant documents, with the exception of privileged or protected documents, will be made available to the public on the City website prior to said meeting.
- 6. Any meeting that utilizes videoconferencing shall be recorded and said recording must be posted on the City's website for public viewing within five (5) business days of

the conclusion of said meeting. Said recording shall remain available to the public to view for a minimum of five years thereafter. Upon request, the recording of said meeting shall be transcribed

The Lockport Common Council shall conspicuously post this Videoconferencing Policy on the City website.

The Lockport Common Council shall, in the minutes of each meeting, keep record of any

Alderman that participated remotely, pursuant to section 106 of Public Officers Law.

This policy shall be suspended, and the limitations therein shall not apply, in the event that the New York State Governor, or the President of the United States, declares a State of Emergency affecting public assembly or public meetings.

 - a. Main Street/East Avenue from Transit to Washburn Street
 - b. Walnut Street from Transit to Washburn Street.
 - c. West Genesee Street and West Avenue from the city line to Transit
- V. The restrictions on parking for buses and delivery vehicles set forth in §183-23(D) shall remain in full force and effect during this period.

City of Lockport NY - Audit Committee Policy

The Audit Committee is composed of financial professionals in the community who are tasked with oversight of the City of Lockport's financial reporting, management capability, and independent third party audit.

Purpose and Mission Statement

A decade ago, the City experienced significant financial distress that required the City to undergo NYS Financing Deficit and annual budgetary review by the NYS Comptroller's Office (NYS OSC). This strain was caused by mismanagement of funds, lack of cohesive budget and planning, a delinquent RFP process, and a weak system of financial reporting and management. Continuous years of budgetary deficits and diminishing fund balances had caused a cash flow shortage that required NYS intervention and funding to resolve.

The City has since made strides to mitigate financial managerial risk and its impact on taxpayers. Though careful planning, budgeting, and accounting, the City has managed to build a strong and robust fund balance in recent years with an increasing cash flow to support operations. While effort has been made into improving our financial conditions and capabilities, there is always room for both improvement as well as oversight to ensure that all measures possible are being taken to ensure no such mismanagement occurs again.

The mission of the Audit Committee is to ensure that the financial management and auditing capabilities are sufficient to fit the ever-changing needs of the City.

Responsibilities

- Review financial data and reports to identify any substantive trends or concerns that may be overlooked.
- Make recommendations on methods to improve financial data, reporting capabilities, accessibility, and internal controls.
- Review City-made corrective-action-plans (CAPs) and ensure that curative action is being done to minimize future audit findings.
- Ensure that a logical methodology is being used in the contracting and RFP (request for proposal) process / selection of the 3rd party auditor.
- Meet with third party auditor to independently review management letter and financial statements.

Composition of the Committee and Selection of Members

The audit committee shall be established appointed by the Mayor. The audit Committee shall consist of at least three members of the public who are independent of City operations. Audit committee members shall be prohibited from being an employee of the City. In addition, audit committee members shall not engage in any private business transactions with the City or receives compensation from an entity that has material business relationships with the City.

It is the expectation that all members on the audit committee shall possess or obtain a basic understanding of governmental financial reporting and auditing.

Meetings and Materials

The audit committee will meet with City officials (typically the Mayor, Treasurer, and Finance Director) three times per year. Once a year, around May, the audit committee members will meet with the third party auditor independent of City officials in order to ask questions and discuss areas of concern with the auditors directly. These four meetings will be documented with meeting minutes that are to be provided to the City Clerk. These quarterly meetings may occur digitally or via phone calls as well as inperson.

Additional meeting may be required to adequately fulfill all of the responsibilities as defined in this policy. Independent communication between the committee members for more frequent review of data is optional.

Materials to be reviewed will primarily consist of:

- Data on the City's Online Open Financial Portal (https://lockportny.gov/lockports-open-financial-data-portal/) which includes balance sheets, budget statements, cash/metric/utility benchmarking, and more.
- Current and prior year financial statements and management letters, obtained on the City's Finance Department website (https://lockportny.gov/departments/finance-department/).
- Other data, reports, and policies published on the City's Finance Department website (https://lockportny.gov/departments/finance-department/).
- Internal monthly finance update reports, to be provided by the Finance Director via email.
- On an annual basis, the third party auditor will provide the audit committee members a draft copy of the upcoming audit findings and financial statements for their review.
- Other materials may be requested to the Finance Director and Treasurer as required.

Committee Expectations and Outputs

Once a year, the committee is responsible for putting together a report addressed to the Mayor that identifies areas of concern / possible improvement as defined in the areas of responsibilities in this policy. Both the minutes and the report will be published online to the City of Lockport's Committees and Boards webpage (https://lockportny.gov/list-of-committeesboard/).

This policy supersedes any resolutions regarding this committee.

WHEREAS, the intent of bail reform was to respond to legitimate concerns relating to the disparity between low income and minority populations being unfairly and unjustly impacted by a monetized bail system. While the intent behind bail reform was to address the disparities, there have been unexpected negative ramifications to same, and we want to ensure the safety of our community; and

WHEREAS, many of these changes have resulted in increased crime across New York State as many repeat offenders are released from police custody without bail during the pretrial period; and

WHEREAS, the State's bail reforms have eliminated the ability of judges to set monetary bail for many categories of criminal offenders, and many defendants are released without any option to impose bail, thereby allowing non-violent suspects, including repeat offenders, back in public shortly after arrest; and

WHEREAS, in addition, speedy trial and discovery reforms were also imposed on courts and District Attorney's offices across the state, which has led to summary dismissals and standing prosecutorial policies electing not to prosecute entire categories of crimes due to the lack of manpower and related inability to comply with the new laws; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

(1) The City of Lockport Common Council urges the New York State Legislature and Governor Kathy Hochul to modify the bail reform laws to allow judges to have more discretion to set monetary bail, and to modify the regulations on speedy trial and discovery reforms; and (2) That certified copies of this resolution be forwarded by the City Clerk to Senator Rob Ortt, Assemblyman Michael Norris, Governor Kathy Hochul, and any other elected official deemed necessary and proper.

PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAXES AGREEMENT BY AND AMONG HARRISON LOFTS HOUSING DEVELOPMENT FUND COMPANY, INC., HARRISION LOFTS LIMITED PARTNERSHIP, AND THE CITY OF LOCKPORT

Whereas the Harrison Lofts Housing Development Fund Company, Inc. is a New York Not-for-Profit corporation organized pursuant to Article XI of the Private Housing Finance Law ("PHFL"), having its principal place of business at c/o YWCA of the Niagara Frontier, Inc., 32 Cottage Street, Lockport, NY 140494 ("HLHDFC"); and

Whereas HLHDFC was formed for the purpose of providing residential rental accommodations for persons of middle income and low-income; and

Whereas HLHDFC is, or will be, the legal owner of record, as nominee for Harrison Lofts Limited Partnership, a New York limited partnership having its principal place of business at c/o The Kearney Realty & Development Group Inc., 57 Route 6, Suite 207, Baldwin Place, New York 10505 ("Partnership"), of real property located at 160 Washburn Street, Lockport, New York 14094 (SBL # 109.14-4-20.1), being Part of Lot 8, 10 & 12, Section 15, Township 14, Range 6 of the Holland Land Company's Survey in the City of Lockport, County of Niagara and State of New York more particularly described in the Nussbaumer & Clarke, Inc. Survey Project No. 1905-0035, dated December 23, 2019 annexed hereto as Exhibit A (the "Property"); and

Whereas HLHDFC and the Partnership will develop, own, construct, maintain and operate a mixed use of commercial use and residential housing project for persons of middle income and low income at the Property (the "Project"); and

Whereas HLHDFC's and the Partnership's plan for the use of the Property constitutes a "housing project" as that term is defined in the PHFL; and

Whereas HLHDFC is a "housing development fund company" as the term is defined in Section 572 of the PHFL; and

Whereas pursuant to Section 577 of the PHFL, the local legislative body of a

municipality may exempt the real property of a housing project of a housing development fund company from local and municipal taxes, including school taxes, other than assessments for local improvements, to the extent of all or a part of the value of the property included in the completed project; and

Whereas Section 577 of the PHFL permits housing development fund companies and local legislative bodies of a municipality to enter into a Payment in Lieu of Taxes ("PILOT" or "Tax Exemption") Agreement; and

Whereas the Common Council Members of the City of Lockport, New York, by Resolution adopted 091521.3 approved and authorized the execution of a PILOT Agreement; and

Whereas the City of Lockport Common Council has considered the land use and financial implications and other policy issues relating to the Tax Exemption,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE UNDERSIGNED PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Pursuant to Section 577 of the PHFL, the City hereby exempts from local and municipal taxes, other than assessments for local improvements, one hundred percent (100%) of the value of the Property, including both land and improvements,. "Local and Municipal Taxes" shall mean any and all real estate taxes levied by Niagara County, the City of Lockport ("City") and the Lockport City School District or other taxing jurisdiction (collectively, the "Taxing Jurisdictions"), but exclude any sales tax that may be due and owing from commercial tenants.
- 2. The tax exemption will commence on the date HLHDFC acquires the Property and expire on the thirty-first (31st) anniversary of the date the Project obtains a Certificate of Occupancy. This PILOT Agreement shall not limit or restrict the HLHDFC's or the Partnership's right to apply for or obtain any other tax exemption to which it might be entitled upon the expiration of this PILOT Agreement. As stated above, the exemption extended pursuant to Section 577 of the PHFL and this PILOT Agreement does not include exemption from special assessments and special ad valorem levies. During the term of this PILOT Agreement, the Partnership shall pay any service charges, special ad valorem levies, special assessments and improvement district charges or similar tax equivalents which are or would be levied upon or with respect to the Project by the Taxing Jurisdictions or any other taxing authority.
- 3. So long as the exemption hereunder continues, commencing one year after the Project obtains a Certificate of Occupancy, the Partnership shall make annual PILOT payments in the amount set forth below, which payments shall cover all Local and Municipal Taxes owed in connection with the Property and the Project, and which payments shall be shared by the Taxing Jurisdictions on the same basis as property taxes would be shared if the Property and the Project were fully taxed. The PILOT payments shall be in the initial amount of \$80,000 per year, increasing by two percent (2%) annually. So long as the tax exemption remains in effect, tenant rental charges shall not exceed the maximum established or allowed by law, rule or regulation, and the Property shall be operated in conformance with the provisions of Article XI of PHFL. PILOT payments shall be due on February 15 of the calendar year following each taxable year to which this

PILOT Agreement applies. Payments shall be mailed via First Class mail through the United States Postal Service or personally delivered to the City of Lockport Treasurer One Locks Plaza, Lockport, New York 14094, or such other address as the City may specify in writing.

- 4. The tax exemption will continue for the term described above provided that (a) the Property continues to be used as housing facilities for persons of middle income and low income in accordance with the income and rent limitations, and (b) any of the following occur (i) the HLHDFC and the Partnership operate the Property in conformance with Article XI of the PHFL; (ii) the HLHDFC assumes sole legal and beneficial ownership of the Property and operates the Property in conformance with Article XI of the PHFL; or (iii) in the event an action is brought to foreclose a mortgage upon the HLHDFC, and the legal and beneficial interest in the Property is acquired at the foreclosure sale or from the mortgagee, or by a conveyance in lieu of such sale, by a housing development fund company organized pursuant to Article XI of the PHFL, and such successor in interest shall operate the Property in conformance with Article XI of the PHFL.
- 5. The failure to make any required PILOT payment will be treated as failure to make payment of taxes and will be governed by the same provisions of law as apply to the failure to make payment of taxes, including, but not limited to, enforcement and collection of taxes to the extent permitted by law. In addition to failure to pay any amount when due, HLHDFC and the Partnership shall be in default of this PILOT Agreement in the event of material failure to observe and perform any other covenant, condition of this PILOT Agreement on its part to be observed and performed, and continuance of such failure for a period of thirty (30) days after written notice specifying the nature of such failure and requesting that it be remedied; or any warranty, representation or other statement by or on behalf of HLHDFC and/or the Partnership contained in this PILOT Agreement shall prove to have been false or untrue in any material respect on the date when made or on the effective date of this PILOT Agreement. Any payment not received by its due date shall accrue interest and penalties at the rates provided for late payment of taxes to the Taxing Jurisdictions.
- 6. All notices and other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be sufficiently given when delivered to the applicable address stated above (or such other address as the party to whom notice is given shall have specified to the party giving notice) by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested or by such other means as shall provide the sender with documentary evidence of such delivery.
- 7. This PILOT Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the City, HLHDFC and the Partnership and their respective successors and assigns, including the successors in interest of HLHDFC and the Partnership. There shall be no assignment of this PILOT Agreement except with consent of the other parties, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld, provided that the assignee or its general partner or managing member shall be a housing development fund company subject to Article XI of the PHFL, the assignee shall have assumed the obligations of this Agreement in writing reasonably satisfactory to the City, and the assignee shall have provided such

financial and other information as shall be reasonably requested by the City in order to assure the proper completion and operation of the housing project and the compliance with the terms of this PILOT Agreement and all applicable laws, regulations and covenants.

- 8. This PILOT Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. If any provision of this PILOT Agreement or its application is held invalid or unenforceable to any extent, the remainder of this PILOT Agreement and the application of that provision to other persons or circumstances shall be enforced to the greatest extent permitted by law.
- 9. This PILOT Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts with the same effect as if all the signing parties had signed the same document. All counterparts shall be construed together and shall constitute the same instrument.
- 10. This PILOT Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties relating to payments in lieu of taxes with respect to the Property and supersedes all prior contracts, or agreements, whether oral or written, with respect thereto.
- 11. Each of the parties individually represents and warrants that the execution, delivery and performance of this PILOT Agreement, (i) has been duly authorized and does not require any other consent or approval, (ii) does not violate any article, by-law or organizational document or any law, rule, regulation, order, writ, judgment or decree by which it is bound, and (iii) will not result in or constitute a default under any indenture, credit agreement, or any other agreement or instrument to which it is a party. Each party represents that this PILOT Agreement shall constitute the legal, valid and binding agreement of such party, enforceable in accordance with its terms.

City of Lockport Local Law No. 4 of the year 2023

A Local Law to amend Section C-45 under Article II – City Officers, General Provisions, City Elections of Chapter C of the Charter Section C-45 relative to the residency requirement shall be amended in the following manner:

§ C-45 Residency Law.

1. The City of Lockport recognizes that emergency situations arise which require employees of the City of Lockport to be near their place of employment and to assume the continuation of public services to protect the health, safety, and general welfare of the people. The City of Lockport believes that those who are residents of the City of Lockport take a greater interest in promoting the public safety and health in the future of this community, than do nonresidents who reside in areas unaffected by City of Lockport services. The City of Lockport further declares that such a quality is desirable for its employees. The legislative body considers that residency by its employees within the community will help to assure continuation of essential public services. However, the City also recognizes the decline in population in the City, and the need to find the best possible candidate for each position within the City of Lockport. candidate may not always be a Resident of the City of Lockport. Therefore, through adoption of this local law, the City of Lockport amends the current local local for residency to require employees to live within five and one half (5.5) miles from One Locks Plaza, Lockport. The legislative body makes a legislative determination that when reviewing candidates for employment opportunities, qualified candidates that reside within 5.5 miles from One Locks Plaza will be given preference over those that are qualified, but do not live in the City and/or within that radius. Further, if there are no qualified City residents who apply for a given position, or residents within 5.5 miles of One Locks Plaza, then qualified residents of the County of Niagara shall be given preference over those candidates that do not live in the County. The City of Lockport determines that the public need for the best qualified candidate is sufficient to require that candidates of the City be given preference, if qualified, over nonresidents, but after the effective date of this local law, it is no longer a mandatory requirement to be a resident of the City of Lockport to be employed by the City, the employee only needs to maintain his or her permanent residence within 5.5 miles of One Locks Plaza. However, this local law does NOT affect any residency requirements of enumerated positions within this City Charter, Code, or employment agreements that specifically require residency, to wit: all elected positions, or the following officer positions: City Clerk, Corporation Counsel, Chief Building Inspector, Chief Water Treatment Plant Operator, Chief Waste Water Treatment Plant Operator, Chief of Police, Chief of Fire.

- **2.** Definition. Residency shall mean, for the purpose of this local law, the actual principal domicile of an individual, where he or she (1) normally sleeps (2) maintains usual personal and household effects (3) lists as an address on tax filings; and lists as his or her address for a motor vehicle registration, if any.
- **3.** Residency for new municipal employees that have a residency requirement as described hereinabove. Except as otherwise provided by law, the City of Lockport hereby maintains a residency requirement for all prospective employees that have been specifically enumerated in this Charter, Code, or in Employment contracts as stated hereinabove. Any other City employee shall be interviewed and/or hired as described hereinabove, with preference given to City residents who are qualified for the position, then residents within 5.5 miles of One Lock Plaza, then County residents who are qualified for the position, then the most qualified candidate if no City or County residents apply. Every person initially employed by the City of Lockport that is an enumerated position for residency, on or after the effective date of this local law shall, as a qualification of employment, become a resident within 5.5 miles of One Locks Plaza, Lockport, within twelve (12) months of the date of initial service for the City of Lockport. During the time of service of such an employee whose enumerated position requires residency, said individual shall not cease to be a resident of the City of Lockport.
- **4.** Exceptions. The requirement of residency within the corporate limits of the City does not apply to temporary employees, temporary advisors and consultants, persons having an independent contractor status and current employees of the City of Lockport, who reside outside the corporate limits of the City. Also exempt from residency requirements are members of the Fire Department and Police Department, so long as the Police Department has 200 or more full-time members as set forth in further detail in Section 30(4) of the Police Officers Law. Finally, the City Engineer position is no longer required to have a residency requirement due to the difficulty the City historically has had filling that position. However, said position of City Engineer does have the requirement of the 5.5 mile residency radius.
- **5.** Residency upon promotion. All employees promoted by the City of Lockport on or after the effective date of this local law, whose position specifically requires residency per the Charter, Code, or employment contract, shall be, or, within twelve (12) months of such promotion shall become, a resident within 5.5 miles of One Locks, Plaza, Lockport.
- **6.** Notice and posting. A copy of this local law shall be provided to each employee upon his or her initial appointment or promotion. However, a failure to do so shall not affect the application of this local law to any employee appointed or promoted after its effective date. A copy of this law shall be posted in all locations normally used for employee communications.

7. Investigation of residency. Should it be alleged that an employee, whose position requires residency, is not in compliance with Section three or four of this local law as the case may be, the City of Lockport may initiate a hearing by providing the employee with written notice of his or her alleged violation and shall allow the employee seven calendar days in which to respond. If there is a failure to respond or if, in the judgment of the City of Lockport, the response is not sufficient to satisfy the requirements of this local law, the City of Lockport shall set a date to hear the charge of nonresidence. The employee shall be sent a notice of the hearing date at least 15 calendar days prior to the hearing. A record of the hearing shall be made. Should an employee whose position requires residency, establish residency to the satisfaction of the City of Lockport prior to the hearing date, it shall result in a cancellation of the hearing authorized by this section.

To conduct the hearing, the City of Lockport may in writing designate an individual who for the purpose of the hearing shall be vested with all powers of the City of Lockport for review and decision. Should the City of Lockport determine that an employee, whose position requires residency, is a nonresident in violation of this local law, the employee shall be notified in writing that he or she has been deemed to have voluntarily resigned from employment as of the date of the determination. Upon reestablishing residency, an individual having so resigned may apply for reinstatement to his or her former position and shall be reinstated if the position is vacant.

- **8.** Waiver of requirements. In the event that the City of Lockport determines that it is in the best interest of the City of Lockport to do so, the provisions of Section three or four as it relates to enumerated positions with residency requirements- may be waived by the appointing/hiring body, with respect to an incumbent or incumbents of a particular title or titles in accordance with the following standards:
- **a)** Lack of applicants. The requirement of residency within 5.5 miles of One Locks Plaza may be waived in those instances where the City of Lockport has difficulty hiring or promoting the most qualified person because of its residency requirements.
- **b)** Necessity for nonresidence. The requirement of residency within 5.5 miles of One Locks Plaza may be waived in those instances where it is determined that residency is not in the best interest of the municipality.

Such a waiver shall not in any way affect the application of Section three or four of this local law with respect to any other title or titles. [Added 3-2-2005 by L.L. No. 3-2005]
