#### 082725.4

By Alderman Craig:

Whereas under New York State law, electric bicycles ("e-bicycles") are legal and classified into three categories, each with specific speed and operational restrictions; and

Whereas municipalities are authorized to enact local regulations regarding the use of ebicycles within their jurisdictions; and

Whereas e-bicycles are generally permitted on roads with speed limits of 30 miles per hour or less, and in bike lanes, with requirements for helmets, lights, and motor limits, but do not require registration, licensing, or insurance; and

Whereas recent accidents involving e-bicycles, including fatalities in Clarence and Niagara Falls, as well as numerous unreported incidents, demonstrate the potential risks to public safety when e-bicycles are operated without adherence to traffic and safety laws; and

**Whereas** in the City of Lockport, e-bicycle riders have been observed operating on sidewalks, business districts, and park walking paths, creating hazards for pedestrians and conflicts with traffic; and

**Whereas** the Common Council finds it necessary to establish clear local regulations to protect the health, safety, and welfare of residents and visitors.

**Now therefore be it resolved**, that the Common Council of the City of Lockport hereby adopts the following regulations governing the use of e-bicycles and e-scooters within the City:

- 1. Use on Streets: E-bicycles may only be operated on City streets where such use is permitted under New York State law, specifically roads with posted speed limits of 30 miles per hour or less.
- **2. Sidewalk Restriction**: The operation of e-bicycles and e-scooters on public sidewalks, whether in residential neighborhoods or business districts, is prohibited.
- **3.** Parks and Pathways Restriction: The operation of e-bicycles and e-scooters in City parks and on public walking or recreational paths is prohibited, unless expressly designated by the City.
- **4. Helmet & Equipment Compliance**: Operators must comply with all New York State requirements regarding helmets, lights, and equipment standards.
- **5. Enforcement**: The Lockport Police Department is authorized to enforce these regulations through verbal warnings, written violations, appearance tickets, and fines.
- **6. Impoundment Authority**: The Lockport Police Department may impound e-bicycles or e-scooters found to be operated in violation of this resolution. Release of an impounded vehicle shall require proof of ownership and payment of an impound fee as established by the City.
- **7. Local Law Violation**: A new section shall be added to the City Charter making violations of this resolution a local law offense, thereby authorizing the issuance of appearance tickets for enforcement purposes.

**Be it further resolved,** that this resolution shall take effect immediately and shall be incorporated into the City Charter and Code of Ordinances accordingly.

#### 082725.10

By Alderman Kirchberger:

**Whereas** the Bewley Building is a historic five-story structure located in the heart of downtown Lockport, New York, currently housing approximately 200 individual offices on its second and third floors and 10 retail stores on the first floor, serving as a vital economic and community anchor for the city; and

Whereas the proposed project by PathStone Development Corporation seeks to convert the existing office and retail spaces into 82 one-bedroom and 18 two-bedroom low-income apartments, with only three commercial spaces remaining, at an estimated cost of sixty-six million dollars, requiring tax-exempt bonds, tax credits and low-interest loans provided by the New York State Housing Finance Agency; and

Whereas the Bewley Building is located adjacent to Urban Park Towers, an existing affordable housing community serving households with incomes at or below 60% of the Area Median Income, which in 2024 required 231 ambulance calls and in the first six months of 2025 required 45 police calls, indicating a significant demand for public services and support already present in the immediate vicinity;

Whereas large-scale, concentrated public housing projects have historically contributed to the clustering of poverty, which research shows can amplify social challenges such as crime, drug use, and school dropouts, and may place additional pressure on local schools, healthcare, law enforcement, and social services; and

Whereas when a significant number low-income residents are concentrated in one area, the risk of social dysfunction my increase, potentially radiating outward and affecting neighboring businesses and property values, and may attract residents with greater social and economic needs from other areas, further straining local resources and service; and

Whereas the City of Lockport has demonstrated a strong commitment to revitalizing its downtown through mixed-use development, historic preservation, and the creation of a vibrant,

walkable environment that attracts a diverse mix of residents and businesses, and has identified a demonstrated demand- for market-rate housing and contued commercial vitality in the downtown core; and

Whereas the conversion of the Bewley Building to a predominantly low-income housing facility would reduce the availability of office and retail space in the downtown area, potentially undermining the city's ongoing efforts to attract new businesses, professionals, and investment, and could disrupt the balance of housing options necessary for a thriving, inclusive community; and

**Now, therefore, be it resolved,** that the Mayor of the City of Lockport and the Common Council respectfully opposes the proposed conversion of the Bewley Building from its current use as a commercial and office hub to a concentrated low-income housing development, and urges all Federal, State, County and other stakeholders to consider alternative proposals that promote a balance of affordable, market-rate, and commercial uses, support the preservation of historic character, and foster the continued economic and social vitality of downtown Lockport.

Be it further resolved that the Mayor and Common Council encourages PathStone Development Corporation, the New York Housing Finance Agency, and other relevant parties to work collaboratively with the City of Lockport and local stakeholders to explore development options that align with the city's comprehensive plans for downtown revitalization, historic preservation, and creation of a diverse, sustainable, and resilient urban core, and

Be it further resolved that the Mayor and Common Council calls for a comprehensive impact assessment of any proposed large-scale affordable housing project in downtown Lockport, including analysis of its effects on public services, local businesses, property values, and the broader community, prior to any final decision on the Bewley Building's future use.

**Be it further resolved** that this resolution of opposition shall supersede any prior letters of approval issued by the City of Lockport, its agents, employees, or assigns.



#### From Police Chief Steven Abbott

In New York, e-bicycles are legal and classified into three classes, each with their own speed and operational restrictions. Generally, e-bicycles can be ridden on roads with speed limits of 30 mph or less, and in bike lanes.

Local municipalities can further regulate their use. Helmets are required for those under 14, and for Class 3 e-bicycle riders.

#### E-Bicycle Classes in New York:

- Class 1: Pedal-assist only, with a maximum speed of 20 mph.
- Class 2: Throttle-assisted, with a maximum speed of 20 mph.
- Class 3: Throttle-assisted, with a maximum speed of 25 mph.

  Class 3 e-bikes are only permitted in NYC.

#### **General Regulations:**

- **Speed:** E-bicycles are generally allowed on roads with speed limits of 30 mph or less.
- Local Ordinances: Municipalities can enact their own regulations regarding where and when e-bicycles can be used.
- **Helmets:** Riders under 14 and all Class 3 e-bicycle riders must wear helmets.
- **Equipment:** E-bicycles must have both a front white light, and a rear red light after sunset.
- Motor: E-bicycle motors are limited to 750 watts.
- Licensing: No license is required to operate an e-bicycle in New York.
- **Registration:** E-bicycles do not need to be registered with the DMV.
- Insurance: While not required, e-bicycle insurance is recommended.

### Sensible safety standards needed for e-bikes

Electric bicycles, commonly known as e-bikes, have become increasingly popular across New York, but there is often confusion about how they differ from the traditional bikes and motorcycles we see every day. A bicycle is fully human powered, while a motorcycle is a much heavier, faster vehicle that requires a license and registration as well as insurance. E-bikes fall somewhere in between: they are lighter, equipped with pedals and powered by small electric motors, which can sometimes reach speeds that make their regulation more complex.

Currently, New York state law recognizes three classes of e-bikes. Class 1 models provide pedal-assist up to 20 miles per hour, Class 2 e-bikes include a throttle and also top out at 20 miles per hour and Class 3 e-bikes can reach 25 miles per hour but are only permitted in New York City. For all classes, riders must be at least 16 years old, no license or registration is required and helmets are mandatory for certain riders, especially those using Class 3

e-bikes or working as delivery cyclists.

Despite what you may see, e-bikes are not allowed on sidewalks and may only be used on roads with a speed limit of 30

miles per hour or less.

Last year, I voted for, and the Legislature passed, Assembly Bill A.7628. This new law requires that accidents involving e-bikes and electric scooters that cause injury or death be clearly documented, including the specific type of vehicle involved. This will give law enforcement and policymakers the accurate data we need to address safety concerns and craft appropriate regulations.

Alongside this measure, the state also enacted new battery safety requirements, ensuring e-bike batteries meet proper manufacturing standards, retailers provide safety information and fire prevention and first responder training are improved. These steps are essential as we work to balance innovation in transportation with the safety of riders, pedestrians and the public.

While it's clear that e-bikes are here to stay, we must make sure our laws keep up. By implementing sensible safety standards, we can encourage responsible use while also protecting our communities.




